A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the renewal by the Texas Commission on Environmental 3 Quality of certain expired occupational licenses and 4 registrations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 37.006, Water Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsections (f) and (g) and adding Subsection (h) to read 8 as follows:

9 (f) A person whose license or registration has been expired 10 for <u>not more than 90</u> [30] days [or less] may apply for renewal of the 11 license or registration by paying to the commission a renewal fee in 12 an amount prescribed by commission rule not to exceed 1-1/2 times 13 the normally required renewal fee.

14 (g) <u>A person whose license or registration has been expired</u> 15 <u>for at least 90 days but not more than one year may apply for renewal</u> 16 <u>of the license or registration by paying to the commission a renewal</u> 17 <u>fee in an amount prescribed by commission rule not to exceed two</u> 18 <u>times the normally required renewal fee.</u>

19 (h) A person whose license or registration has been expired 20 for <u>at least one year</u> [more than 30 days] may not renew the license 21 or registration. The person may obtain a new license or 22 registration by complying with the requirements and procedures, 23 including the examination requirements, for obtaining an original 24 license or registration.
