Section 61.506(b), Education Code, is amended to 3 read as follows: 4 5 (b) Each of the pilot programs must provide services to an economically depressed or rural medically underserved area of the 6 One pilot program must be located in an urban area, one 7 state. 8 pilot program must be located in a rural area, and the remaining pilot program or programs must be located in the Texas-Mexico 9 border region as defined by Section 2056.002 [481.001], Government 10 Code. 11 SECTION 4. Section 772.0071(a)(2), Government Code, 12 is amended to read as follows: 13 14 (2) "Border region" has the meaning assigned to 15 "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002 [means the portion of this state that is located in a county that: 16 17 [(A) is adjacent to an international border; [(B) is adjacent to a county described by 18 19 Paragraph (A); or [(C) is served by a prosecuting attorney whose 20 jurisdiction includes a county described by Paragraph (A) or (B)]. 21 SECTION 5. Section 772.011(d), Government Code, is amended 22 23 to read as follows: 24 (d) In this section, "border region" has the meaning assigned to "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002 [means 25 the portion of this state located within 100 kilometers of this 26 state's international border]. 27

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1 SECTION 6. Section 772.051, Government Code, is amended by 2 amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as 3 follows:

4 (1) "Border crime" <u>has</u> [and "border region" have] the
5 <u>meaning</u> [meanings] assigned by Section 772.0071.

6 (2-a) "Border region" has the meaning assigned to
7 "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002.

8 SECTION 7. Section 120.001(1), Health and Safety Code, is 9 amended to read as follows:

10 (1) "Border region" <u>has the meaning assigned to</u> 11 <u>"Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002, Government Code</u> 12 [means the area consisting of the counties immediately adjacent to 13 the international boundary between the United States and Mexico].

SECTION 8. Section 201.109(b), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

16 (b) In carrying out this section, the commission shall 17 provide for:

18 (1) maximizing the generation of revenue from existing19 assets of the department, including real estate;

(2) increasing the role of the private sector and
public-private projects in the leasing of real estate and other
assets in the development of highway projects;

(3) setting and attempting to meet annual revenueenhancement goals;

(4) reporting on the progress in meeting revenue26 enhancement goals in the department's annual report;

27 (5) contracting for an independent audit of the

2 12th year after 2007;

3 (6) developing a cost-benefit analysis between the use 4 of local materials previously incorporated into roadways versus use 5 of materials blended or transported from other sources; and

6 (7) increasing private investment the in 7 transportation infrastructure, including the acquisition of 8 causeways, bridges, tunnels, turnpikes, or other transportation facilities, in the Texas-Mexico border region, as defined by 9 Section 2056.002, Government Code [including the counties of 10 Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Brewster, Brooks, Cameron, Crockett, 11 Culberson, Dimmit, Duval, Edwards, El Paso, Frio, Hidalgo, 12 Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, Jim Hogg, Jim Wells, Kenedy, Kerr, Kimble, 13 Kinney, Kleberg, La Salle, Live Oak, Maverick, McMullen, Medina, 14 15 Nueces, Pecos, Presidio, Real, Reeves, San Patricio, Starr, Sutton, Terrell, Uvalde, Val Verde, Webb, Willacy, Zapata, and Zavala]. 16

SECTION 9. Section 6.112(a), Water Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) In this section, "border region" <u>has the meaning</u>
<u>assigned to "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002,</u>
<u>Government Code</u> [means the portion of this state located within 100
<u>kilometers of this state's international border</u>].

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SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2026.
