- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2056.002(e)(3), Government Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (3) "Texas-Mexico border region" means the area
- 8 consisting of the counties of Atascosa, Bandera, Bee, Bexar,
- 9 Brewster, Brooks, Cameron, Crockett, Culberson, Dimmit, Duval,
- 10 Edwards, El Paso, Frio, Hidalgo, Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, Jim Hogg,
- 11 Jim Wells, Karnes, Kenedy, Kerr, Kimble, Kinney, Kleberg, La Salle,
- 12 Live Oak, Loving, Mason, Maverick, McCulloch, McMullen, Medina,
- 13 Menard, Nueces, Pecos, Presidio, Reagan, Real, Reeves, San
- 14 Patricio, Starr, Sutton, Terrell, Upton, Uvalde, Val Verde, Ward,
- 15 Webb, Willacy, Wilson, Zapata, and Zavala.
- SECTION 2. Section 61.0821(a), Education Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (a) In this section, "border region" has the meaning
- 19 assigned to "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002,
- 20 Government Code [means the area composed of the counties of
- 21 Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Brewster, Brooks, Cameron, Crockett,
- 22 Culberson, Dimmit, Duval, Edwards, El Paso, Frio, Hidalgo,
- 23 Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, Jim Hogg, Jim Wells, Kenedy, Kerr, Kimble,
- 24 Kinney, Kleberg, Live Oak, La Salle, Maverick, McMullen, Medina,

- 1 Nueces, Pecos, Presidio, Real, Reeves, San Patricio, Starr, Sutton,
- 2 Terrell, Uvalde, Val Verde, Webb, Willacy, Zapata, and Zavala].
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 61.506(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (b) Each of the pilot programs must provide services to an
- 6 economically depressed or rural medically underserved area of the
- 7 state. One pilot program must be located in an urban area, one
- 8 pilot program must be located in a rural area, and the remaining
- 9 pilot program or programs must be located in the Texas-Mexico
- 10 border region as defined by Section 2056.002 [481.001], Government
- 11 Code.
- SECTION 4. Section 772.0071(a)(2), Government Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (2) "Border region" has the meaning assigned to
- 15 "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002 [means the portion
- 16 of this state that is located in a county that:
- 17 [(A) is adjacent to an international border;
- 18 [(B) is adjacent to a county described by
- 19 Paragraph (A); or
- [(C) is served by a prosecuting attorney whose
- 21 jurisdiction includes a county described by Paragraph (Λ) or (B)].
- SECTION 5. Section 772.011(d), Government Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (d) In this section, "border region" has the meaning
- 25 assigned to "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002 [means
- 26 the portion of this state located within 100 kilometers of this
- 27 state's international border].

- 1 SECTION 6. Section 772.051, Government Code, is amended by
- 2 amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 (1) "Border crime" has [and "border region" have] the
- 5 <u>meaning</u> [meanings] assigned by Section 772.0071.
- 6 (2-a) "Border region" has the meaning assigned to
- 7 "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002.
- 8 SECTION 7. Section 120.001(1), Health and Safety Code, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 (1) "Border region" has the meaning assigned to
- 11 "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002, Government Code
- 12 [means the area consisting of the counties immediately adjacent to
- 13 the international boundary between the United States and Mexico].
- 14 SECTION 8. Section 201.109(b), Transportation Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (b) In carrying out this section, the commission shall
- 17 provide for:
- 18 (1) maximizing the generation of revenue from existing
- 19 assets of the department, including real estate;
- 20 (2) increasing the role of the private sector and
- 21 public-private projects in the leasing of real estate and other
- 22 assets in the development of highway projects;
- 23 (3) setting and attempting to meet annual revenue
- 24 enhancement goals;
- 25 (4) reporting on the progress in meeting revenue
- 26 enhancement goals in the department's annual report;
- 27 (5) contracting for an independent audit of the

- 1 department's management and business operations in 2007 and each
- 2 12th year after 2007;
- 3 (6) developing a cost-benefit analysis between the use
- 4 of local materials previously incorporated into roadways versus use
- 5 of materials blended or transported from other sources; and
- 6 (7) increasing private investment in the
- 7 transportation infrastructure, including the acquisition of
- 8 causeways, bridges, tunnels, turnpikes, or other transportation
- 9 facilities, in the <u>Texas-Mexico</u> border region, <u>as defined by</u>
- 10 <u>Section 2056.002</u>, <u>Government Code</u> [including the counties of
- 11 Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Brewster, Brooks, Cameron, Crockett,
- 12 Culberson, Dimmit, Duval, Edwards, El Paso, Frio, Hidalgo,
- 13 Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, Jim Hogg, Jim Wells, Kenedy, Kerr, Kimble,
- 14 Kinney, Kleberg, La Salle, Live Oak, Maverick, McMullen, Medina,
- 15 Nueces, Pecos, Presidio, Real, Reeves, San Patricio, Starr, Sutton,
- 16 Terrell, Uvalde, Val Verde, Webb, Willacy, Zapata, and Zavala].
- SECTION 9. Section 6.112(a), Water Code, is amended to read
- 18 as follows:
- 19 (a) In this section, "border region" has the meaning
- 20 assigned to "Texas-Mexico border region" by Section 2056.002,
- 21 Government Code [means the portion of this state located within 100
- 22 <u>kilometers of this state's international border</u>].
- 23 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2026.
