2	relating to the installation of conduit by the Texas Department of
3	Transportation in the state highway system.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 202.092, Transportation Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	Sec. 202.092. <u>INSTALLATION AND</u> USE OF DEPARTMENT
8	FACILITIES. (a) For each road construction or reconstruction
9	project in a part of the state highway system in which
10	telecommunications conduit has not been installed under the
11	improved portion of the highway, the department shall:
12	(1) provide for the installation of
13	telecommunications conduit as part of the project at intervals not
14	to exceed:
15	(A) one mile in an unincorporated area; and
16	(B) 500 feet in an incorporated area; and
17	(2) ensure that access points to the conduit are
18	provided at each interval described by Subdivision (1) to
19	facilitate use by a telecommunications provider.
20	(b) Notwithstanding any other law, a telecommunications
21	provider may not place or maintain its facilities or otherwise use
22	improvements, including structures, medians, conduits, or
23	telecommunications equipment or lines, constructed or installed by
24	the state as components of the state highway system except by a

- 1 lease under Section 202.052 or an agreement under Section 202.093.
- 2 SECTION 2. Sections 201.671, 201.672, and 201.673,
- 3 Transportation Code, are transferred to Chapter 250,
- 4 Transportation Code, redesignated as Section 250.003,
- 5 Transportation Code, and amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 250.003 [201.671]. COORDINATION OF BROADBAND
- 7 INSTALLATION [DEFINITIONS]. (a) In this section [subchapter]:
- 8 (1) "Broadband" means a mass-market retail service by
- 9 wire or radio that provides the capability to transmit data to and
- 10 receive data from all or substantially all Internet endpoints,
- 11 including capabilities that are incidental to and enable the
- 12 operation of the service. The term includes a service that is
- 13 functionally equivalent to the service described by this
- 14 subdivision.
- 15 (2) "Broadband conduit" means a conduit, pipe,
- 16 innerduct, or microduct for fiber-optic or other cables that
- 17 supports broadband and wireless facilities for broadband.
- 18 (b) [Sec. 201.672. COORDINATION. (a)] The department
- 19 shall provide notice on the department's Internet website of
- 20 ongoing and planned highway construction projects for which the
- 21 department will provide voluntary joint trenching opportunities in
- 22 the state's right-of-way for broadband providers. A broadband
- 23 provider may collaborate with the department to deploy broadband
- 24 conduit or other broadband facilities in those rights-of-way.
- (c) [(b)] The department shall give special consideration
- 26 to broadband deployment described by Subsection (b) $[\frac{a}{a}]$ that is
- 27 likely to improve access to broadband by rural or underserved

- 2 (d) $[\frac{c}{c}]$ To the extent practicable, the department shall
- 3 assist political subdivisions in taking advantage of voluntary
- 4 joint trenching opportunities.
- 5 (e) This section applies only to a highway construction
- 6 project to which Section 202.092(a) does not apply.
- 7 (f) [Sec. 201.673. REPORT.] Annually, the department shall
- 8 submit to the legislature a report that explains the actions taken
- 9 by the department in carrying out this subchapter and identifies
- 10 any costs or cost savings to the state and private entities
- 11 associated with voluntary joint trenching opportunities.
- 12 SECTION 3. The heading to Subchapter H-1, Chapter 201,
- 13 Transportation Code, is repealed.
- 14 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 15 to a road construction or reconstruction project initiated on or
- 16 after the effective date of this Act. A road construction or
- 17 reconstruction project initiated before the effective date of this
- 18 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the project was
- 19 initiated, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 20 purpose.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
