A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the display of the Ten Commandments in public schools.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 1, Education Code, is amended by adding
5	Section 1.0041 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 1.0041. DISPLAY OF TEN COMMANDMENTS. (a) A public
7	elementary or secondary school shall display in a conspicuous place
8	in each classroom of the school a durable poster or framed copy of
9	the Ten Commandments that meets the requirements of Subsection (b).
10	(b) A poster or framed copy of the Ten Commandments
11	described by Subsection (a) must:
12	(1) include the text of the Ten Commandments as
13	provided by Subsection (c) in a size and typeface that is legible to
14	a person with average vision from anywhere in the classroom in which
15	the poster or framed copy is displayed; and
16	(2) be at least 16 inches wide and 20 inches tall.
17	(c) The text of the poster or framed copy of the Ten
18	Commandments described by Subsection (a) must read as follows:
19	"The Ten Commandments
20	I am the LORD your God.
21	1. You shall have no other gods before me.
22	2. You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything
23	in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below.

3. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.

- 1 4. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
- 2 5. Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in
- 3 the land the Lord your God is giving you.
- 4 6. You shall not murder.
- 5 7. You shall not commit adultery.
- 6 8. You shall not steal.
- 7 9. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.
- 8 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet
- 9 your neighbor's wife, or his male or female servant, his ox or
- 10 donkey, mor anything that belongs to your neighbor."
- 11 (d) A public elementary or secondary school in which each
- 12 classroom does not include a poster or framed copy of the Ten
- 13 Commandments as required by Subsection (a) must:
- 14 (1) accept any offer of a privately donated poster or
- 15 framed copy of the Ten Commandments provided that the poster or
- 16 <u>copy:</u>
- 17 (A) meets the requirements of Subsection (b); and
- 18 (B) does not contain any additional content; and
- 19 (2) display the poster or framed copy as specified in
- 20 Subsection (a).
- 21 <u>(e) If a public elementary or secondary school has a poster</u>
- 22 or framed copy of the Ten Commandments in each classroom that does
- 23 not meet the requirements of Subsection (b), the school may replace
- 24 the posters or copies with posters or copies that meet the
- 25 requirements of Subsection (b) using public funds or by accepting a
- 26 private donation.
- 27 (f) A public elementary or secondary school must offer a

- 1 poster or framed copy of the Ten Commandments described by
- 2 Subsection (a) in the school's possession that is not needed for
- 3 display in a classroom as a donation to another public elementary or
- 4 secondary school.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 6 school year.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
