A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter L, Chapter 441, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 441.207 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 441.207. CARE, CUSTODY, AND DISPLAY OF VICTORY OR
9	DEATH LETTER, TEXAS CONSTITUTION, AND TEXAS DECLARATION OF
10	INDEPENDENCE. (a) In this section, "victory or death letter" means
11	the letter written by Lieutenant Colonel William B. Travis dated
12	February 24, 1836, and signed "Victory or Death."
13	(b) The commission is responsible for the care and custody

15	Texas Declaration of Independence.

7	(e) The commission shall collaborate with the Texas
8	Historical Commission and State Preservation Board to determine an
9	appropriate public location at the Capitol Complex for the secure

12	(f) Costs attributable to the display of the victory or
13	death letter, the Texas Constitution, and the Texas Declaration of
