1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the armed security officers required to be present at
1-22 public schools and the appointment of reserve police officers by a
1-23 school district police department.

1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-25 SECTION 1. Article [2A.001](#), Code of Criminal Procedure, is
1-26 amended to conform to Section 2, Chapter 624 (H.B. 4372), Section 1,
1-27 Chapter 870 (H.B. 3981), Section 1, Chapter 950 (S.B. 1727), and
1-28 Section 1, Chapter 984 (S.B. 2612), Acts of the 88th Legislature,
1-29 Regular Session, 2023, and is further amended to read as follows:

1-30 Art. 2A.001. PEACE OFFICERS GENERALLY. The following are
1-31 peace officers:

1-32 (1) a sheriff, a sheriff's deputy, or a reserve deputy
1-33 sheriff who holds a permanent peace officer license issued under
1-34 Chapter [1701](#), Occupations Code;

1-35 (2) a constable, a deputy constable, or a reserve
1-36 deputy constable who holds a permanent peace officer license issued
1-37 under Chapter [1701](#), Occupations Code;

1-38 (3) a marshal or police officer of a municipality or a
1-39 reserve municipal police officer who holds a permanent peace
1-40 officer license issued under Chapter [1701](#), Occupations Code;

1-41 (4) a ranger, officer, or member of the reserve
1-42 officer corps commissioned by the Public Safety Commission and the
1-43 director of the Department of Public Safety;

1-44 (5) an investigator of a district attorney's, criminal
1-45 district attorney's, or county attorney's office;

1-46 (6) a law enforcement agent of the Texas Alcoholic
1-47 Beverage Commission;

1-48 (7) a member of an arson investigating unit
1-49 commissioned by a municipality, a county, or the state;

 2-59 Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code;

SECTION 2. Section 37.0814(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) A security officer described by Subsection (a) must be:

(1) a school district peace officer;
 (2) a school resource officer; ~~or~~
 (3) a commissioned peace officer employed as security personnel under Section 37.081;

(4) a reserve deputy sheriff appointed under Section 85.004, Local Government Code, who is a peace officer as described by Article 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure;

(5) a reserve police officer appointed under Section 37.0816 who is a peace officer as described by Article 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure; or

(6) an honorably retired peace officer, as that term is defined by Section 614.121, Government Code, who has:

(A) kept their commission as a peace officer in active status; and

(B) fulfilled all applicable requirements under Sections 1701.351, 1701.3525, and 1701.357, Occupations Code.

SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 37.0816 to read as follows:

Sec. 37.0816. RESERVE POLICE OFFICERS. (a) The board of trustees of a school district may authorize the chief of police of the school district police department to appoint reserve police officers for the district. The board may limit the number of reserve police officers that the chief may appoint.

(b) A reserve police officer serves at the discretion of the chief of police of the school district police department and may be called into service at any time that the chief considers it necessary to have additional officers to preserve the peace and enforce the law.

(c) The chief of police of a school district police department may authorize a reserve police officer who holds a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, to carry a weapon or act as a peace officer at all times, regardless of whether the reserve police officer is engaged in the actual discharge of official duties, or may limit the authority of the reserve police officer to carry a weapon or act as a peace officer to only those times during which the reserve police officer is engaged in the actual discharge of official duties.

(d) A reserve police officer who does not hold a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, may act as a peace officer only:

(1) if the officer has fulfilled all applicable requirements under Sections 1701.351 and 1701.3525, Occupations Code; and

(2) during the actual discharge of official duties.

(e) A reserve police officer on active duty at the call of the chief of police of the school district police department and actively engaged in assigned duties has the same rights, privileges, and duties as any other peace officer of the state.

(f) A reserve police officer, regardless of whether the reserve police officer holds a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is not:

(1) eligible for participation in any program provided by the agency or the board of trustees of the school district that is normally considered a financial benefit of full-time employment or for any pension fund created by statute for the benefit of full-time paid peace officers; or

(2) exempt from Chapter 1702, Occupations Code.

SECTION 4. Section 1701.001(6), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

(6) "Reserve law enforcement officer" means a person designated as a reserve law enforcement officer under Section 37.0816, Education Code, Section 85.004, 86.012, or 341.012, Local Government Code, or Section 60.0775, Water Code.

SECTION 5. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails

4-4 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
