8 (a) The governing board of an institution of higher 9 education shall exempt from the payment of tuition and laboratory 10 fees <u>a student enrolled in one or more courses offered as part of a</u> 11 <u>law enforcement-related degree program</u> [charged by the institution 12 for a criminal justice or law enforcement course or courses an 13 <u>undergraduate student</u>] who:

14 (1) is employed as a peace officer by this state or by15 a political subdivision of this state;

16 (2) is enrolled in a [criminal justice or] law 17 enforcement-related degree program at the institution;

18 (3) is making satisfactory academic progress toward
19 the student's degree as determined by the institution; [and]

20 (4) <u>holds a basic peace officer proficiency</u>
 21 <u>certificate issued by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement under</u>

1 the applicable semester or other term. 2 (a-1) For purposes of Subsection (a), a enforcement-related degree program includes a program in: 3 4 (1) criminal justice; 5 (2) public administration and public affairs; (3) emergency management; 6 7 (4) youth and community studies; 8 (5) law; Spanish or any other foreign language commonly 9 (6) 10 spoken in this state; (7) accounting, including forensic accounting; 11 12 (8) psychology; (9) social work, including clinical social work; 13 14 (10) nursing; 15 (11) chemistry; 16 (12) biology; 17 (13) forensic science; or (14) computer science, 18 data science, 19 cybersecurity. SECTION 2. Section 54.3531, Education Code, as amended by 20

this Act, applies beginning with tuition and other fees charged for 21 22 the 2025 fall semester. Tuition and other fees charged for an academic period before that semester are governed by the law in 23 24 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the 25 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27
