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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of an advisory committee to study and make recommendations on services provided to individuals with an 3 intellectual or developmental disability. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 547, Government Code, as effective April 7 1, 2025, is amended by adding Subchapter D-1 to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER D-1. INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY 8 9 SERVICES AND SUPPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE Sec. 547.0191. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "advisory 10 committee" means the intellectual and developmental disability 11 services and supports advisory committee established under this 12 13 subchapter. 14 Sec. 547.0192. ESTABLISHMENT OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The commission shall establish the intellectual and developmental 15 16 disability services and supports advisory committee to: 17 (1) conduct a study identifying and evaluating gaps in access to acute and long-term care services and supports for 18 19 individuals with an intellectual or developmental disability; and (2) provide to the legislature recommendations to 20 21 address those gaps in access. Sec. 547.0193. ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBERS. 22 (a) The 23 executive commissioner shall appoint relevant stakeholders to 24 serve as advisory committee members, including:

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1	(1) representatives of the commission;
2	(2) representatives of the Department of State Health
3	Services;
4	(3) representatives of the Private Providers
5	Association of Texas;
6	(4) representatives of local intellectual and
7	developmental disability authorities;
8	(5) representatives of intellectual and developmental
9	disability advocacy organizations;
10	(6) persons with expertise on intellectual and
11	developmental disability services and supports;
12	(7) representatives of long-term services and
13	supports providers;
14	(8) representatives of managed care organizations;
15	(9) individuals with an intellectual or developmental
16	disability who receive services or supports; and
17	(10) parents or other family members of individuals
18	with an intellectual or developmental disability who receive
19	services or supports.
20	(b) The executive commissioner shall appoint an advisory
21	committee member to serve as the advisory committee's presiding
22	officer.
23	(c) The executive commissioner shall fill a vacancy that
24	occurs on the advisory committee in the same manner as the original
25	appointment as soon as practicable but not later than the 60th day
26	after the date the vacancy occurs.
27	Sec. 547.0194. EXPENSES. An advisory committee member is

1 not entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for 2 actual and necessary expenses incurred in performing advisory committee duties. The advisory committee may accept gifts, grants, 3 4 and donations to pay for those expenses. 5 Sec. 547.0195. MEETINGS. (a) The advisory committee shall meet at least quarterly. 6 7 (b) The advisory committee may conduct meetings in person or 8 remotely. 9 Sec. 547.0196. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. The commission 10 shall provide administrative support for the advisory committee 11 using existing resources. 12 Sec. 547.0197. STUDY; BIENNIAL REPORT. (a) The advisory 13 committee shall: 14 (1) evaluate the adequacy of state and federal funding 15 for acute and long-term care services and supports for individuals with an intellectual or developmental disability; 16 17 (2) evaluate the financial sustainability of current 18 service delivery models; 19 (3) evaluate the availability and capacity of trained 20 professionals, caregivers, and support staff necessary to deliver services for individuals with an intellectual or developmental 21 22 disability; 23 (4) identify best practices and innovative models used 24 in and outside this state for services provided to individuals with 25 an intellectual or developmental disability; 26 (5) evaluate the quality of current services provided in this state to individuals with an intellectual or developmental 27

2	(6) evaluate the effectiveness of programs designed to
3	promote health, education, employment, and community inclusion for
4	individuals with an intellectual or developmental disability;
5	(7) identify factors that contribute to mental health
6	conditions affecting individuals with an intellectual or
7	developmental disability;
8	(8) evaluate public safety net services, including the
9	role, functions, and capacity of local intellectual and
10	developmental disability authorities to coordinate services and
11	supports to meet the needs of individuals with an intellectual or
12	developmental disability; and
13	(9) review and identify areas for improvement to the
14	Texas Statewide Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities
15	Strategic Plan developed by the IDD Strategic Planning Group.
16	(b) Not later than August 31 of each even-numbered year, the
17	advisory committee shall prepare and submit to the legislature and
18	each standing committee of the legislature with primary
19	jurisdiction over intellectual and developmental disability issues
20	a written report that includes:
21	(1) a summary of the results of the advisory
22	committee's findings under Subsection (a);
23	(2) recommendations to address gaps in access to acute
24	and long-term care services and supports for individuals with an
25	intellectual or developmental disability;
26	(3) recommendations for legislative or administrative
27	action, including legislation or rules, to implement the advisory

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1	<pre>committee's recommendations;</pre>
2	(4) a complete explanation of each of the advisory
3	committee's recommendations; and
4	(5) suggested timelines for implementing each of the
5	advisory committee's recommendations.
6	Sec. 547.0198. EXPIRATION. (a) Not later than December 1,
7	2028, the commission shall prepare and submit to the legislature a
8	report that contains a recommendation on whether the advisory
9	committee should be continued or abolished.
10	(b) The advisory committee is abolished and this subchapter
11	expires September 1, 2029.
12	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
13	of this Act but not later than December 1, 2025, the executive
14	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
15	appoint members to the intellectual and developmental disability
16	services and supports advisory committee as required by Section
17	547.0193, Government Code, as added by this Act.

18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
