4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 161.0041(c), (d), and (e), Health and

6 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

- 7 (c) The department shall develop a blank affidavit form for
- 8 a person to use in claiming an exemption from a required
- 9 immunization under this section and post the affidavit form in a
- 10 printable format on the department's Internet website. A person
- 11 claiming an exemption from a required immunization [under this
- 12 $\frac{\text{section}}{\text{section}}$] may $\frac{\text{also}}{\text{section}}$] obtain the affidavit form by submitting a
- 13 written request for the affidavit form to the department. A person
- 14 may not be required to provide any information to obtain a blank
- 15 affidavit form under this subsection.
- 16 (d) [The department shall develop a blank affidavit form
- 17 that contains a seal or other security device to prevent
- 18 reproduction of the form. The affidavit form shall contain a
- 19 statement indicating that the person or, if a minor, the person's
- 20 parent, managing conservator, or guardian understands the benefits
- 21 and risks of immunizations and the benefits and risks of not being
- 22 immunized.
- (e) The department may [shall] maintain a record of the
- 24 total number of times an affidavit form was accessed on the

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- 1 department's Internet website or requested under Subsection (c)
- 2 [forms sent out each year and shall report that information to the
- 3 legislature each year]. The department may not maintain a record of
- 4 any personally identifying information [the names] of individuals
- 5 who <u>download</u>, <u>access</u>, request, <u>or submit</u> an affidavit <u>form</u> under
- 6 this section.
- 7 SECTION 2. Not later than the 30th day after the effective
- 8 date of this Act, the Department of State Health Services shall
- 9 modify the existing affidavit form required by Section 161.0041,
- 10 Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
