- 23 (3) the procedure for a customer to apply to be
- 24 considered a critical care residential customer, a critical load

- 1 industrial customer, or critical load according to commission rules
- 2 adopted under Section 38.076; [and]
- 3 (4) reducing electricity use at times when involuntary
- 4 load shedding events may be implemented; and
- 5 (5) the procedure for a customer to request vegetation
- 6 management near a transmission or distribution line.
- 7 (d-2) A retail electric utility shall periodically provide
- 8 with bills sent to retail customers of the utility information
- 9 about the procedure for a customer to request vegetation management
- 10 near a transmission or distribution line.
- SECTION 2. Section 17.005(f), Utilities Code, is amended to

- 13 (f) A municipally owned utility shall periodically provide
- 14 with bills sent to retail customers of the utility information

- 3 SECTION 3. Section 17.006(f), Utilities Code, is amended to

- 6 bills sent to retail customers of the cooperative information
- 7 about:
- 8 (1) the cooperative's procedure for implementing
- 9 involuntary load shedding;
- 10 (2) the types of customers who may be considered
- 11 critical care residential customers, critical load industrial
- 12 customers, or critical load according to commission rules adopted
- 13 under Section 38.076;
- 14 (3) the procedure for a customer to apply to be
- 15 considered a critical care residential customer, a critical load
- 16 industrial customer, or critical load according to commission rules
- 17 adopted under Section 38.076; [and]
- 18 (4) reducing electricity use at times when involuntary
- 19 load shedding events may be implemented; and
