A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to notice provided to a retail electric customer of the 3 procedure for requesting vegetation management near a transmission 4 or distribution line.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 17.003, Utilities Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (d-1) and adding Subsection (d-2) to read as 8 follows:

9 (d-1) An electric utility providing electric delivery 10 service for a retail electric provider, as defined by Section 11 31.002, shall provide to the retail electric provider, and the 12 retail electric provider shall periodically provide to the retail 13 electric provider's retail customers together with bills sent to 14 the customers, information about:

(1) the electric utility's procedures for implementing involuntary load shedding initiated by the independent organization certified under Section 39.151 for the ERCOT power region;

19 (2) the types of customers who may be considered 20 critical care residential customers, critical load industrial 21 customers, or critical load according to commission rules adopted 22 under Section 38.076;

(3) the procedure for a customer to apply to beconsidered a critical care residential customer, a critical load

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1 industrial customer, or critical load according to commission rules adopted under Section 38.076; [and] 2 3 (4) reducing electricity use at times when involuntary load shedding events may be implemented; and 4 5 (5) the procedure for a customer to request vegetation management near a transmission or distribution line. 6 (d-2) A retail electric utility shall periodically provide 7 with bills sent to retail customers of the utility information 8 about the procedure for a customer to request vegetation management 9 10 near a transmission or distribution line. SECTION 2. Section 17.005(f), Utilities Code, is amended to 11 read as follows: 12 A municipally owned utility shall periodically provide 13 (f) 14 with bills sent to retail customers of the utility information 15 about: 16 (1) the utility's procedure for implementing 17 involuntary load shedding; (2) the types of customers who may be considered 18 critical care residential customers, critical load industrial 19 customers, or critical load according to commission rules adopted 20 under Section 38.076; 21 (3) the procedure for a customer to apply to be 22 23 considered a critical care residential customer, a critical load 24 industrial customer, or critical load according to commission rules adopted under Section 38.076; [and] 25 (4) reducing electricity use at times when involuntary 26 27 load shedding events may be implemented; and

Section 17.006(f), Utilities Code, is amended to 3 4 read as follows: 5 (f) An electric cooperative shall periodically provide with bills sent to retail customers of the cooperative information 6 7 about: 8 (1) the cooperative's procedure for implementing involuntary load shedding; 9 (2) the types of customers who may be considered 10 critical care residential customers, critical load industrial 11 customers, or critical load according to commission rules adopted 12 under Section 38.076; 13 14 (3) the procedure for a customer to apply to be 15 considered a critical care residential customer, a critical load industrial customer, or critical load according to commission rules 16 17 adopted under Section 38.076; [and] 18 (4) reducing electricity use at times when involuntary 19 load shedding events may be implemented; and 20 (5) the procedure for a customer to request vegetation management near a transmission or distribution line. 21 SECTION 4.
