A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to license plates and license plate windshield insignia
- 3 issued for and displayed on a vehicle; authorizing a fee; creating a
- 4 criminal offense.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 504.010, Transportation Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) On payment of the prescribed fee, an applicant for motor
- 10 vehicle registration shall be issued a license plate or set of
- 11 plates, provided that the department must issue a set of two plates
- 12 to an applicant for registration of a passenger car or light truck.
- 13 (d) Rules adopted under Subsection (c) must:
- 14 (1) authorize a passenger car or light truck to
- 15 display only a rear license plate if the motor vehicle is not
- 16 equipped by the manufacturer with an exterior front feature to
- 17 which a license plate may be fastened without drilling through the
- 18 exterior of the vehicle; and
- 19 <u>(2) require a vehicle that displays only a rear</u>
- 20 license plate under Subdivision (1) to display a license plate
- 21 windshield insignia.
- 22 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 504, Transportation Code,
- 23 is amended by adding Section 504.011 to read as follows:
- Sec. 504.011. ISSUANCE AND PLACEMENT OF LICENSE PLATE

- 1 WINDSHIELD INSIGNIA. (a) The department shall issue a license
- 2 plate windshield insignia to an applicant for registration of a
- 3 passenger car or light truck if:
- 4 (1) the applicant:
- 5 (A) applies for the license plate windshield
- 6 insignia in the form and manner prescribed by the department; and
- 7 (B) pays the prescribed fee for the license plate
- 8 windshield insignia; and
- 9 (2) the passenger car or light truck is not equipped by
- 10 the manufacturer with an exterior front feature to which a license
- 11 plate may be fastened without drilling through the exterior of the
- 12 vehicle.
- 13 (b) The department by rule may:
- 14 (1) prescribe the manner and form of an application
- 15 for a license plate windshield insignia;
- (2) establish a reasonable fee for a license plate
- 17 windshield insignia in an amount necessary to cover the costs of
- 18 administering this section; and
- 19 (3) determine the information and documentation
- 20 required to demonstrate eligibility for a license plate windshield
- 21 <u>insignia.</u>
- (c) The department by rule shall prescribe the form of the
- 23 license plate windshield insignia and the manner in which the
- 24 license plate windshield insignia must be displayed. Rules adopted
- 25 under this subsection must require that a license plate windshield
- 26 insignia issued under this section:
- 27 (1) show the same information that is required to be

- 1 shown on the license plate issued for the vehicle; and
- 2 (2) be displayed in the interior of the vehicle's front
- 3 windshield.
- 4 (d) The operator of a passenger car or light truck that
- 5 displays a license plate windshield insignia issued under this
- 6 section and only a rear license plate shall:
- 7 (1) have in the operator's possession while operating
- 8 the vehicle the unmounted license plate issued for the vehicle
- 9 under Section 504.010(a); and
- 10 (2) at the request of a peace officer, produce for
- 11 inspection the unmounted license plate issued for the vehicle under
- 12 Section 504.010(a).
- SECTION 3. The heading to Section 504.943, Transportation
- 14 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 504.943. OPERATION OF VEHICLE WITHOUT REQUIRED LICENSE
- 16 PLATE OR LICENSE PLATE WINDSHIELD INSIGNIA.
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 504.943, Transportation Code, is amended
- 18 by amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsections (a-1),
- 19 (d-1), and (f) to read as follows:
- 20 (a) A [Except as provided by Subsection (b), a] person
- 21 commits an offense if the person operates on a public highway,
- 22 during a registration period, a [motor] vehicle that does not
- 23 display <u>all</u> [two] license plates <u>and any license plate windshield</u>
- 24 insignia required by this chapter or a rule adopted under this
- 25 chapter to be displayed on the vehicle that:
- 26 (1) have been assigned by the department for the
- 27 period; and

- 1 (2) comply with department rules regarding the
- 2 placement of license plates and license plate windshield insignia.
- 3 (a-1) A person commits an offense if the person operates on
- 4 a public highway a passenger car or light truck that displays a
- 5 license plate windshield insignia and only a rear license plate
- 6 and:
- 7 (1) the unmounted license plate issued for the vehicle
- 8 under Section 504.010(a) is not in the person's possession; or
- 9 (2) the person fails to produce for inspection, on the
- 10 request of a peace officer, the unmounted license plate issued for
- 11 the vehicle under Section 504.010(a).
- 12 (d) A court may dismiss a charge brought under Subsection
- 13 (a) $\left[\frac{(a)(1)}{(a)}\right]$ if the defendant:
- 14 (1) remedies the defect before the defendant's first
- 15 court appearance; and
- 16 (2) pays a reimbursement fee not to exceed \$10.
- 17 (d-1) A court may dismiss a charge brought under Subsection
- 18 (a-1) if the defendant:
- 19 (1) produces in court the unmounted license plate
- 20 issued for the vehicle under Section 504.010(a); and
- 21 (2) pays a reimbursement fee not to exceed \$10.
- 22 (f) A peace officer may not stop a motor vehicle or detain
- 23 the operator of a motor vehicle solely to enforce Subsection (a-1)
- 24 if the vehicle displays a license plate windshield insignia that:
- 25 (1) has been assigned by the department for the
- 26 registration period; and
- 27 (2) complies with department rules regarding the

- 1 placement of the license plate windshield insignia.
- 2 SECTION 5. Section 504.943(b), Transportation Code, is
- 3 repealed.
- 4 SECTION 6. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 8 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 9 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 10 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 11 before that date.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
