## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study regarding the effects of perfluoroalkyl and
- 3 polyfluoroalkyl chemicals on public health.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. STUDY. (a) The president of the University of
- 6 Houston shall designate a department or entity at the university to
- 7 conduct, in collaboration with the Railroad Commission of Texas,
- 8 the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, and the Department
- 9 of State Health Services, a study on the effects of perfluoroalkyl
- 10 and polyfluoroalkyl chemicals on public health. The study must
- 11 include an assessment of the health impact of perfluoroalkyl and
- 12 polyfluoroalkyl chemicals found in:
- 13 (1) produce, meat, and other food and beverage
- 14 products, including their packaging;
- 15 (2) groundwater, rivers, lakes, reservoirs, and other
- 16 water sources used to supply the public with drinking water; and
- 17 (3) equipment or materials that:
- 18 (A) likely contain perfluoroalkyl and
- 19 polyfluoroalkyl chemicals; and
- 20 (B) regularly come in contact with
- 21 professionals, including firefighters and chemical manufacturing
- 22 workers.
- 23 (b) For the purposes of collaborating with the department or
- 24 entity designated under Subsection (a), the Railroad Commission of

- 1 Texas, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, and the
- 2 Department of State Health Services may coordinate with any other
- 3 state agency as necessary.
- 4 SECTION 2. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2026,
- 5 the department or entity at the University of Houston designated
- 6 by the president of the university to conduct the study under
- 7 Section 1 of this Act shall prepare a report with the conclusions of
- 8 the study and submit the report to the legislature.
- 9 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. This Act expires December 31, 2026.
- SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 11 1, 2025.
