5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 767 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 767. REGULATION OF CHILD SWIM INSTRUCTION OPERATORS
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 767.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as the
11	Mitchell Chang Swim Safety Act.
12	Sec. 767.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
13	(1) "Commission" means the Texas Commission of
14	Licensing and Regulation.
15	(2) "Controlling person" means a person listed in
16	Section 51.409(a)(5), Occupations Code.
17	(3) "Department" means the Texas Department of
18	Licensing and Regulation.
19	(4) "Executive director" means the executive director
20	of the department.
21	(5) "Instructor" means an individual who for
22	compensation provides swim instruction directly to students on
23	behalf of an operator.

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(6) "Operator" means a company, corporation,

- 1 partnership, or limited liability corporation that employs two or
- 2 more employees and provides or offers to provide swim instruction
- 3 for compensation.
- 4 (7) "Serious incident" means a suspected or actual
- 5 incident that occurs during and as a direct result of swim
- 6 instruction and that threatens or impairs the health, safety, or
- 7 well-being of a student. The term includes:
- 8 (A) abuse, neglect, exploitation, or death of a
- 9 student;
- 10 (B) a critical injury of a student; and
- 11 (C) an illness of a student that requires
- 12 hospitalization.
- 13 (8) "Student" means a child who is younger than seven
- 14 years of age.
- 15 (9) "Swim instruction" means the in-water educational
- 16 process of teaching an individual to swim.
- 17 Sec. 767.003. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER; EXEMPTIONS. (a)
- 18 Subject to Subsection (b), this chapter applies only to an operator
- 19 who provides swim instruction to a group of three or more students
- 20 at one time.
- 21 (b) This chapter does not apply to swim instruction provided
- 22 to students by:
- 23 (1) a youth camp licensed under Chapter 141;
- 24 (2) a child-care facility licensed under Chapter 42,
- 25 Human Resources Code; or
- 26 (3) a political subdivision.

- 5 or suspended, an operator's license issued under this chapter is
- 6 valid until the second anniversary of the date of issuance.

- 8 department in the form and manner prescribed by commission rule an
- 9 application for license renewal.
- 10 <u>(c) The department shall renew the operator's license of a</u>

- 21 <u>SUBCHAPTER D. OPERATIONAL STANDARDS</u>
- Sec. 767.151. MINIMUM SAFETY REQUIREMENTS. The commission
- 23 by rule shall establish minimum safety requirements for operators
- 24 to preserve student health and safety, including requirements on:
- 25 (1) instructor to student ratios during swim
- 26 instruction;
- 27 (2) training and certification for instructors; and

(3) available and operational automated external 1 2 defibrillators, as defined by Section 779.001. Sec. 767.152. CERTIFICATION AND TRAINING REQUIREMENTS. (a) 3 Each manager and instructor for the operator must hold: 4 (1) a certificate to teach swimming techniques to 5 students after successfully completing training that complies with 6 7 the swim instructor training standards established by the American 8 Red Cross, the YMCA, or another entity the department approves with swim instructor training standards substantially the same as those 9 10 established by the American Red Cross or the YMCA; and (2) certifications from the American Red Cross, the 11 12 American Heart Association, or another nationally recognized entity the department approves for: 13 14 (A) cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and 15 (B) automated external defibrillator use. (b) An operator shall provide basic training to all 16 17 employees in: 18 (1) basic water rescue techniques; and 19 (2) the provision of first aid. (c) An operator shall maintain records of 20 certifications and training required by this section in the manner 21 22 prescribed by commission rule. Sec. 767.153. REPORT OF SERIOUS INCIDENTS. (a) An operator 23 24 shall report to the department each serious incident involving a student who was under the supervision of an operator or an 25

- 4 INFORMATION CHECK. (a) Before an operator may hire an instructor
- 5 or any other individual who will interact with students in the
- 6 course and scope of the individual's employment, the operator shall
- 7 perform a criminal history record information check on the
- 8 individual.
- 9 (b) An operator may not hire an instructor or any other
- 10 individual who will interact with students in the course and scope
- 11 of the individual's employment if the individual has been convicted
- 12 of an offense under Title 5, Penal Code, or Chapter 43, Penal Code,
- 13 involving an individual who is younger than 18 years of age.
- 14 SUBCHAPTER E. ENFORCEMENT
- Sec. 767.201. GROUNDS FOR LICENSE DENIAL AND DISCIPLINARY
- 16 ACTION. An applicant for an operator's license or a license holder
- 17 may be subject to denial of a license application or disciplinary
- 18 action, as applicable, if the applicant or license holder or a
- 19 controlling person of the applicant's or license holder's company,
- 20 corporation, partnership, or limited liability corporation:
- 21 (1) violates this chapter, a commission rule, or an
- 22 order of the commission or the executive director;
- (2) obtains an operator's license by means of fraud,
- 24 misrepresentation, or concealment of a material fact;
- 25 (3) sells, barters, or offers to sell or barter an
- 26 operator's license; or
- 27 (4) is convicted of, or employs an instructor or any

- 2 scope of the individual's employment and who has been convicted of,
- 3 an offense under Title 5, Penal Code, or Chapter 43, Penal Code,
- 4 involving a child who is younger than 18 years of age.
- 5 Sec. 767.202. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY; OTHER ENFORCEMENT
- 6 ACTION. (a) A person who violates this chapter or a rule adopted
- 7 under this chapter is subject to an administrative penalty or other
- 8 penalties and enforcement action in accordance with Subchapters F
- 9 and G, Chapter 51, Occupations Code.
- 10 (b) An administrative penalty may not exceed \$500 per day
- 11 for each violation. Each day a violation continues is a separate
- 12 violation for purposes of imposing a penalty.

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          Sec. 411.0975. ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY

    INFORMATION: SWIM INSTRUCTION OPERATORS. (a) In this section,
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   "swim instruction operator" means a person who holds a license
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   under Chapter 767, Health and Safety Code, to operate as a swim
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   instruction operator.
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          (b) A swim instruction operator may obtain state criminal
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    history record information from the department for an applicant for
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instruction operator in the original form or any subsequent form:

(c) Criminal history record information obtained by a swim

(1) may not be released to any person except the person

- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
