(a) The executive 8 9 director shall allow a correctional officer employed by the department to voluntarily transfer to a legislative leave pool up 10 to eight hours of compensatory time or annual leave per year earned 11 by the correctional officer. 12 (b) The executive director or the executive director's 13 designee shall administer the legislative leave pool. 14 (c) The board shall adopt rules and prescribe procedures 15 16 relating to the operation of the legislative leave pool. (d) The executive director or the executive director's 17 designee shall credit the legislative leave pool with the amount of 18 time contributed by a correctional officer employed by the 19 department and deduct a corresponding amount of time from the 20 correctional officer's earned compensatory time or annual leave as 21 if the correctional officer had used the time for personal 22 23 purposes. (e) A correctional officer employed by the department is 24

1	entitled to use time contributed to the legislative leave pool if
2	the correctional officer uses the time for legislative leave on
3	behalf of an association:
4	(1) related to the correctional officer's employment
5	with the department;
6	(2) that has at least 5,000 active or retired members;
7	and
8	(3) that is governed by a board of directors.
9	(f) The executive director or the executive director's
10	designee shall transfer time from the pool to the correctional
11	officer and credit the time to the correctional officer.
12	(g) A correctional officer employed by the department may
13	only withdraw time from the legislative leave pool in coordination
14	with and with the consent of the president or designee of the
15	association described in Subsection (e). A correctional officer
16	may not draw more than 80 hours from the pool in a 160-hour work
17	cycle and may not draw more than 480 hours from the pool in a fiscal
18	year.
19	(h) A correctional officer employed by the department shall
20	use time from the legislative leave pool in accordance with rules
21	adopted by the board.
22	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
