2	relating to tuition and fee exemptions at public institutions of
3	higher education for the siblings of certain military personnel.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 54.341 , Education Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsections (a-2) and (b-1) and adding Subsection (a-5) to
7	read as follows:
8	(a-2) The exemptions provided for in Subsection (a) also
9	apply to the spouse or a sibling of:
10	(1) a member of the armed forces of the United States:
11	(A) who was killed in action;
12	(B) who died while in service;
13	(C) who is missing in action;
14	(D) whose death is documented to be directly
15	caused by illness or injury connected with service in the armed
16	forces of the United States; or
17	(E) who became totally and permanently disabled
18	or meets the eligibility requirements for individual
19	unemployability according to the disability ratings of the
20	Department of Veterans Affairs as a result of a service-related
21	injury; or
22	(2) a member of the Texas National Guard or the Texas
23	Air National Guard who:
24	(A) was killed since January 1, 1946, while on

- 1 active duty either in the service of this state or the United
- 2 States; or
- 3 (B) is totally and permanently disabled or meets
- 4 the eligibility requirements for individual unemployability
- 5 according to the disability ratings of the Department of Veterans
- 6 Affairs, regardless of whether the member is eligible to receive
- 7 disability benefits from the department, as a result of a
- 8 service-related injury suffered since January 1, 1946, while on
- 9 active duty either in the service of this state or the United
- 10 States.
- 11 (a-5) A sibling of a member of the armed forces may qualify
- 12 for an exemption under Subsection (a-2) only if the member does not
- 13 have a spouse or child.
- 14 (b-1) To qualify for an exemption under Subsection (a-2) or
- 15 (b), the spouse, [or] child, or sibling must be classified as a
- 16 resident under Subchapter B on the date of the spouse's, [or]
- 17 child's, or sibling's registration.
- SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 19 54.341, Education Code, apply beginning with tuition and fees
- 20 charged for the 2025 fall semester. Tuition and fees charged for a
- 21 term or semester before the 2025 fall semester are covered by the
- 22 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 23 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
