A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 3 | reporting grant program by the Texas Education Agency. |
| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 29, Education Code, is |
| 6 | amended by adding Section 29.195 to read as follows: |
| 7 | Sec. 29.195. CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION REPORTING GRANT |
| 8 | PROGRAM. (a) From funds appropriated or otherwise available for |
| 9 | the purpose, the agency shall establish and administer a career and |
| 10 | technical education reporting grant program to award grants to |
| 11 | school districts and open-enrollment charter schools to facilitate |
| 12 | the collection, analysis, and reporting of career- and technical |
| 13 | education-related data to enhance program effectiveness and |
| 14 | student outcomes at the local and state levels. |
| 15 | (b) The agency shall adopt rules to establish and administer |
| 16 | the grant program under this section, including rules: |
| 17 | (1) establishing application procedures and |
| 18 | deadlines; |
| 19 | (2) establishing grant eligibility criteria; and |
| 20 | (3) prioritizing grant applications that demonstrate |
| 21 | the potential for significant positive effects on: |
| 22 | (A) career and technical education program |
| 23 | outcomes; and |
| 24 | (B) workforce readiness of students. |

| 1 | (c) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may |
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| 2 | use a grant awarded under this section to: |
| 3 | (1) implement strategies and procure software for |
| 4 | collecting and analyzing career and technical education data, |
| 5 | including: |
| 6 | (A) tracking student engagement in experiences |
| 7 | provided by career technical student organizations outside the |
| 8 | classroom, including: |
| 9 | (i) community service or other events; |
| 10 | (ii) competitions; and |
| 11 | (iii) awards; |
| 12 | (B) tracking student hours worked, training |
| 13 | plans, and teacher visits in work-based learning classes offered by |
| 14 | the district or school; |
| 15 | (C) tracking student results on industry-based |
| 16 | certifications, including information regarding the applicable |
| 17 | course and teacher and the cost for the certification; |
| 18 | (D) identifying students who demonstrate |
| 19 | college, career, or military readiness and tracking which |
| 20 | performance measures the students meet in real time; and |
| 21 | (E) maintaining information regarding enrollment |
| 22 | in career and technical education courses and programs of study, |
| 23 | disaggregated by: |
| 24 | (i) race; |
| 25 | (ii) ethnicity; |
| 26 | (iii) gender; and |
| 27 | (iv) special populations; |

- 1 (2) train district or school employees in the use of
- 2 data analytics software; and
- 3 (3) to the extent possible, improve the integration of
- 4 career and technical education data with the Public Education
- 5 Information Management System (PEIMS).
- 6 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 7 of this Act, the Texas Education Agency shall establish the career
- 8 and technical education reporting grant program required by Section
- 9 29.195, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
