A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the receipt of financial benefits by the superintendent 3 of a school district for certain services performed by the superintendent. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 11.201, Education Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsections (f) and (g) to read as follows: 8 The superintendent of a school district may not receive 9 (e) any financial benefit for personal services performed by the 10 superintendent for: 11 12 (1) any business entity that conducts or solicits 13 business with the district; 14 (2) an education business that provides services regarding the curriculum or administration of any school district; 15 16 or (3) another school district. 17 (f) Any financial benefit received by the superintendent 18 for performing personal services for any [other] entity not 19 described by Subsection (e), including an [a school district,] 20 21 open-enrollment charter school, regional education service center, or public or private institution of higher education, must be 22 23 approved by the board of trustees on a case-by-case basis in an open 24 meeting.

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(g) For purposes of <u>Subsections (e) and (f)</u> [this
subsection], the receipt of reimbursement for a reasonable expense
is not considered a financial benefit.

4 SECTION 2. Section 11.201, Education Code, as amended by 5 this Act, applies only to a financial benefit received by the 6 superintendent of a school district on or after the effective date 7 of this Act.

8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
