Section 755.022(a), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 8 (a) This chapter does not apply to: 9 (1) boilers owned or operated by the federal 10 government; 11 (2) pressure vessels or process steam generators, 12 other than steam collection or liberation drums of process steam 13 generators; 14 (3) manually fired miniature boilers that: 15 (A) are constructed or maintained for 16 locomotives, boats, tractors, or stationary engines only as a hobby for exhibition, recreation, education, or historical purposes and 17 not for commercial use; 18 (B) have an inside diameter of 12 inches or less 19 20 or a grate area of two square feet or less; and 21 (C) are equipped with a safety valve of adequate 22 size, a water level indicator, and a pressure gauge; 23 (4) boilers that are designed for operation only at 24 atmospheric pressure and that are equipped with two independent

2	(5) steam cookers; [or]
3	(6) espresso machines <u>;</u>
4	(7) boilers that are a component of a medical device
5	regulated by the United States Food and Drug Administration and are
6	of a size that does not exceed:
7	(A) an inside shell diameter of 16 inches;
8	(B) 20 square feet of heating surface, unless the
9	boiler is electric;
10	(C) five cubic feet of gross volume, excluding
11	the casing and insulation; and
12	(D) an allowable working pressure of 100 pounds
13	per square inch gauge; or
14	(8) unfired pressure vessels in an autoclave.
15	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
