	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to requirements for the approval by the Public Utility
3	Commission of Texas of certain coastal facilities for the provision
4	of electric service.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 37, Utilities Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 37.0561 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 37.0561. COASTAL WIND POWER FACILITY. (a) In this
9	section, "wind power facility" includes:
10	(1) a wind turbine generator; and
11	(2) a facility or equipment used to support the
12	operation of a wind turbine generator, including an electrical
13	transmission or communications line, an electric transformer, a
14	battery storage facility, an energy storage facility, or
15	telecommunications equipment.
16	(b) In addition to any applicable requirements of Section
17	33.2053(b), Natural Resources Code, the commission shall comply
18	with the requirements of this section when considering an
19	application for a certificate of convenience and necessity related
20	to installing or operating:
21	(1) a wind power facility located in the area in the
22	Gulf of Mexico seaward of the coast that is within three marine
23	leagues of the coast, as set under Section 11.0111, Natural
24	Resources Code; or

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1	(2) a transmission or distribution facility that
2	directly interconnects to a wind power facility located in the area
3	in the Gulf of Mexico seaward of the coast that is within three
4	marine leagues of the coast, as set under Section 11.0111, Natural
5	Resources Code.
6	(c) The commission may not grant a certificate described by
7	Subsection (b) if the commission finds that:
8	(1) the wind power facility or interconnected
9	transmission facility:
10	(A) may negatively affect established industries
11	or community values based on established industries, including:
12	(i) shipping routes;
13	(ii) general tourism; or
14	(iii) recreational and commercial fishing;
15	(B) may negatively affect the environment, such
16	as by negatively affecting the general welfare of wildlife or
17	disrupting migratory patterns; or
18	(C) may create risks for the safety of coastal
19	residents, industries, or wildlife due to the facility's location
20	in an area historically susceptible to natural disasters; or
21	(2) the public convenience and necessity does not
22	require and will not require the installation or operation of the
23	facility because electricity service is adequate in the areas that
24	would be served by the facility.
25	SECTION 2. This Act applies only to an application for a
26	certificate of convenience and necessity for which the Public
27	Utility Commission of Texas has not issued a final order before the

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1 effective date of this Act.

2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
