## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to an exemption from jury service for a person who is over
- 3 the age of 65.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 62.106(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A person qualified to serve as a petit juror may
- 8 establish an exemption from jury service if the person:
- 9 (1) is over 65 [<del>75</del>] years of age;
- 10 (2) has legal custody of a child younger than 12 years
- 11 of age and the person's service on the jury requires leaving the
- 12 child without adequate supervision;
- 13 (3) is a student of a public or private secondary
- 14 school;
- 15 (4) is a person enrolled and in actual attendance at an
- 16 institution of higher education;
- 17 (5) is an officer or an employee of the senate, the
- 18 house of representatives, or any department, commission, board,
- 19 office, or other agency in the legislative branch of state
- 20 government;
- 21 (6) is summoned for service in a county with a
- 22 population of at least 200,000, unless that county uses a jury plan
- 23 under Section 62.011 and the period authorized under Section
- 24 62.011(b)(5) exceeds two years, and the person has served as a petit

- 1 juror in the county during the 24-month period preceding the date
- 2 the person is to appear for jury service;
- 3 (7) is the primary caretaker of a person who is unable
- 4 to care for himself or herself;
- 5 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b), is summoned
- 6 for service in a county with a population of at least 250,000 and
- 7 the person has served as a petit juror in the county during the
- 8 three-year period preceding the date the person is to appear for
- 9 jury service; or
- 10 (9) is a member of the United States military forces
- 11 serving on active duty and deployed to a location away from the
- 12 person's home station and out of the person's county of residence.
- SECTION 2. Section 62.107(c), Government Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (c) A person who <u>is over 75 years of age and who</u> files a
- 16 statement with a clerk of the court  $[\tau]$  as provided by Subsection
- 17 (a)  $[\tau]$  claiming an exemption under Section 62.106(a)(1) [because
- 18 the person is over 75 years of age, also claim the permanent
- 19 exemption [on that ground] authorized by Section 62.108 by
- 20 including in the statement filed with the clerk a declaration that
- 21 the person desires the permanent exemption. Promptly after a
- 22 statement claiming a permanent exemption on the basis of age is
- 23 filed, the clerk of the court with whom it is filed shall have a copy
- 24 delivered to the voter registrar of the county.
- 25 SECTION 3. Section 62.108(a), Government Code, is amended
- 26 to read as follows:
- 27 (a) A person who is over 75 years of age and who is entitled

- 2 the person is over 75 years of age] may establish a permanent
- 3 exemption on the [that] ground of being over 75 years of age as
- 4 provided by this section or Section 62.107.
- 5 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 6 the establishment of an exemption from jury service for a person
- 7 summoned to appear for jury service on a date on or after the
- 8 effective date of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
