4 (d) Not later than November 1, 2026, the council shall
5 prepare and submit to the Texas Department of Housing and Community
6 Affairs and the legislature a written report that:

7 (1) summarizes the results of the study conducted8 under this section; and

9 (2) includes legislative recommendations based on the 10 results of the study, including recommendations to improve the 11 transition of youth out of foster care and the juvenile justice 12 system.

13 SECTION 2. This Act expires December 31, 2026.

14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
