5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 51.311 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 51.311. NUTRITION MEDICAL EDUCATION COURSEWORK. (a)
8	In this section, "medical school" means:
9	(1) a medical school as defined by Section 61.501; or
10	(2) any other institution of higher education, as
11	defined by Section 61.003, or school, department, or college of
12	such an institution, that awards medical degrees.
13	(b) Each medical school shall include in the curriculum
14	required for a medical degree at least three hours of coursework in
15	nutrition. The coursework must cover, at a minimum, information
16	about:
17	(1) normal caloric intake for healthy adults;
18	(2) diet modifications for individuals with food
19	allergies, diabetes, or other chronic conditions that require diet
20	modification;
21	(3) the importance of proper nutrition as a primary
22	strategy to prevent certain diseases and conditions, such as
23	diabetes, hypertension, and obesity; and
24	(4) additives commonly found in food and beverage

1	products produced in the United States, as opposed to food and
2	beverage products produced in foreign countries.
3	(c) The coursework required under Subsection (b) may not be
4	developed, funded, or influenced by a pharmaceutical company or a
5	food or beverage company.
6	(d) This section does not apply to the requirements for the
7	degree program of a student who entered the degree program at a
8	medical school before the 2026 spring semester. This subsection
9	expires January 1, 2032.
10	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
11	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
12	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

14 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
