A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to proof of the identity of a child's parents in a suit

- 3 affecting the parent-child relationship.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 102.008, Family Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (c-1) and amending Subsection (d) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (c-1) The petitioner shall additionally submit to the court
- 9 a certified copy of the child's birth certificate if available to
- 10 the petitioner. If a certified copy of the child's birth
- 11 certificate is not available to the petitioner, the court at any
- 12 time during the pendency of the suit may request another party to
- 13 whom a certified copy of the child's birth certificate is available
- 14 to submit a copy to the court. If a certified copy of the child's
- 15 birth certificate is not available to any party or if the copy does
- 16 not name both of the child's parents, the court may request from any
- 17 party at any time during the pendency of the suit alternative proof
- 18 of the identity of the child's parents. The court shall keep
- 19 confidential any certificate or other proof submitted under this
- 20 <u>subsection</u>.
- 21 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, if
- 22 the Title IV-D agency files a petition in a suit affecting the
- 23 parent-child relationship, the agency is not required to:
- 24 (1) include in the petition the statement described by

- 1 Subsection (b)(11); [or]
- 2 (2) attach copies of the documentation described by
- 3 Subsection (c); or
- 4 (3) submit to the court a copy of a child's birth
- 5 certificate or other proof of the identity of the child's parents as
- 6 described by Subsection (c-1).
- 7 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 8 suit affecting the parent-child relationship that is filed on or
- 9 after the effective date of this Act. A suit affecting the
- 10 parent-child relationship filed before the effective date of this
- 11 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the suit was filed,
- 12 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
