A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to proof of the identity of a child's parents in a suit affecting the parent-child relationship. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 102.008, Family Code, is amended by 5 adding Subsection (c-1) and amending Subsection (d) to read as 6 7 follows: (c-1) The petitioner shall additionally submit to the court 8 a certified copy of the child's birth certificate if available to 9 the petitioner. If a certified copy of the child's birth 10 certificate is not available to the petitioner, the court at any 11 time during the pendency of the suit may request another party to 12 whom a certified copy of the child's birth certificate is available 13 to submit a copy to the court. If a certified copy of the child's 14 birth certificate is not available to any party or if the copy does 15 16 not name both of the child's parents, the court may request from any party at any time during the pendency of the suit alternative proof 17 of the identity of the child's parents. The court shall keep 18 confidential any certificate or other proof submitted under this 19 subs<u>ection.</u> 20 21 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, if the Title IV-D agency files a petition in a suit affecting the 22

7 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a 8 suit affecting the parent-child relationship that is filed on or 9 after the effective date of this Act. A suit affecting the 10 parent-child relationship filed before the effective date of this 11 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the suit was filed, 12 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
