## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of an advisory committee to study and
3	provide recommendations to state agencies on ways to increase
4	efficiency at the agencies.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 10, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 2117 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 2117. TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY
9	Sec. 2117.001. ESTABLISHMENT AND NAME OF ADVISORY
10	COMMITTEE. (a) An advisory committee is established to study and
11	make recommendations to each state agency in the executive branch
12	of state government on ways to increase the efficiency with which
13	the agency operates.
14	(b) The advisory committee shall be referred to as the Texas
15	Department of Government Efficiency.
16	Sec. 2117.002. COMPOSITION OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The
17	advisory committee is composed of the following eight members:
18	(1) two members appointed by the governor;
19	(2) two members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
20	(3) two members appointed by the speaker of the house
21	of representatives;
22	(4) the chair of the senate committee on finance; and
23	(5) the chair of the house committee or
24	appropriations.
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1	(b) In making appointments to the advisory committee under
2	Subsection (a):
3	(1) the governor may:
4	(A) appoint two public members to the committee;
5	or
6	(B) appoint one public member to the committee
7	and elect to serve as a member of the committee;
8	(2) the lieutenant governor may:
9	(A) appoint two public members to the committee;
10	or
11	(B) appoint one public member to the committee
12	and:
13	(i) elect to serve as a member of the
14	<pre>committee; or</pre>
15	(ii) appoint a member of the senate to the
16	<pre>committee; and</pre>
17	(3) the speaker of the house of representatives may:
18	(A) appoint two public members to the committee;
19	or
20	(B) appoint one public member to the committee
21	and:
22	(i) elect to serve as a member of the
23	committee; or
24	(ii) appoint another member of the house of
25	representatives to the committee.
26	Sec. 2117.003. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Members of the advisory
27	committee serve two-year terms.

- 1 (b) A vacancy on the advisory committee shall be filled in
- 2 the same manner as the original appointment. A member appointed to
- 3 fill a vacancy on the committee shall serve for the remainder of the
- 4 unexpired term.
- 5 Sec. 2117.004. PRESIDING OFFICER. (a) If the governor
- 6 serves as a member of the advisory committee, the governor is the
- 7 presiding officer of the committee.
- 8 (b) If the governor is not a member of the advisory
- 9 committee, the governor shall appoint one member of the committee
- 10 to serve as the committee's presiding officer.
- 11 (c) The presiding officer of the advisory committee serves a
- 12 two-year term.
- Sec. 2117.005. MEETINGS. The advisory committee shall meet
- 14 at the call of the committee's presiding officer.
- Sec. 2117.006. REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES. Members of the
- 16 advisory committee serve without compensation but are entitled to
- 17 reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in
- 18 performing official duties under this chapter.
- 19 Sec. 2117.007. PURPOSE OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The advisory
- 20 committee is established to:
- 21 (1) study the operation of each state agency in
- 22 accordance with a schedule adopted by the committee to identify
- 23 ways to increase the efficiency with which the agency operates;
- 24 (2) recommend to each state agency that is the subject
- 25 of a study described by Subdivision (1) ways of increasing the
- 26 agency's operational efficiency identified by the committee during
- 27 the study; and

- 1 (3) prepare and submit the report required by Section
- 2 2117.008.
- 3 Sec. 2117.008. ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT. Not later than
- 4 December 1 of each even-numbered year, the advisory committee shall
- 5 prepare and submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and
- 6 each member of the legislature a report that includes:
- 7 (1) the name of each state agency studied by the
- 8 committee under Section 2117.007(1) during the two-year period
- 9 preceding the date of the report and the recommendations made to
- 10 each of those agencies under Section 2117.007(2); and
- 11 (2) any proposed legislation prepared by the committee
- 12 related to the information described by Subdivision (1) or any
- 13 other matter the committee determines is relevant to the efficient
- 14 operation of state agencies.
- Sec. 2117.009. APPLICATION OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110 does
- 16 <u>not apply to the advisory committee.</u>
- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
