- 2 relating to a study of rural firefighting and technical rescue
- 3 service capabilities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. STUDY ON RURAL FIREFIGHTING AND TECHNICAL RESCUE
- 6 SERVICE CAPABILITIES. (a) In this Act, "service" means the Texas
- 7 A&M Engineering Extension Service.
- 8 (b) The service shall conduct a study of rural firefighting
- 9 and technical rescue service capabilities and compare those
- 10 capabilities with those of urban municipalities. The study must
- 11 consider disparities in:
- 12 (1) available funding for personnel and equipment;
- 13 (2) the number of qualified candidates to fill new or
- 14 vacant firefighting and rescue personnel positions;
- 15 (3) opportunities for affordable training for
- 16 firefighting and rescue personnel; and
- 17 (4) any other factor the service considers relevant.
- 18 SECTION 2. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2026, the
- 19 service shall submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and
- 20 the speaker of the house of representatives a report that includes
- 21 the findings of the study and any recommendations based on the
- 22 study.
- 23 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2027.
- 24 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
