- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 32, Family Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 32. CONSENT TO CERTAIN TREATMENT, CARE, AND SERVICES FOR
- 8 [OF] CHILD BY NON-PARENT, MINOR PARENT, OR CHILD
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 32.003(a), Family Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 (a) A child may consent to medical, dental, psychological,
- 12 and surgical treatment for the child by a licensed physician or
- 13 dentist if the child:
- 14 (1) is on active duty with the armed services of the
- 15 United States of America;
- 16 (2) is:
- 17 (A) 16 years of age or older and resides separate
- 18 and apart from the child's parents, managing conservator, or
- 19 guardian, with or without the consent of the parents, managing
- 20 conservator, or guardian and regardless of the duration of the
- 21 residence; and
- (B) managing the child's own financial affairs,
- 23 regardless of the source of the income;
- 24 (3) consents to the diagnosis and treatment of an

- 1 infectious, contagious, or communicable disease that is required by
- 2 law or a rule to be reported by the licensed physician or dentist to
- 3 a local health officer or the Texas Department of Health, including
- 4 all diseases within the scope of Section 81.041, Health and Safety
- 5 Code;
- 6 (4) is unmarried and pregnant and consents to
- 7 hospital, medical, or surgical treatment, other than abortion,
- 8 related to the pregnancy;
- 9 (5) consents to examination and treatment for drug or
- 10 chemical addiction, drug or chemical dependency, or any other
- 11 condition directly related to drug or chemical use;
- 12 (6) is unmarried, is the parent of a child, and has
- 13 actual custody of that [his or her] child [and consents to medical,
- 14 dental, psychological, or surgical treatment for the child]; or
- 15 (7) is serving a term of confinement in a facility
- 16 operated by or under contract with the Texas Department of Criminal
- 17 Justice, unless the treatment would constitute a prohibited
- 18 practice under Section 164.052(a)(19), Occupations Code.
- 19 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 32, Family Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Section 32.0031 to read as follows:
- Sec. 32.0031. CONSENT TO TREATMENT OF CHILD BY MINOR
- 22 PARENT. A minor who is the parent of a child may consent to medical,
- 23 dental, psychological, and surgical treatment for the child by a
- 24 licensed physician or dentist if the minor:
- 25 (1) is unmarried; and
- 26 (2) has actual custody of the child.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
