6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Section 2A.205, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
8	transferred to Subchapter B, Chapter 402, Government
9	Code, redesignated as Section 402.0352, Government Code, and
10	amended to read as follows:
11	Sec. 402.0352 [Art. 2A.205]. REPORTING OF [CERTAIN LAW
12	ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES: REPORT CONCERNING] HUMAN TRAFFICKING CASES.
13	(a) This <u>section</u> [article] applies only to:
14	(1) a municipal police department, sheriff's
15	department, constable's office, county attorney's office, district
16	attorney's office, and criminal district attorney's office, as
17	applicable, in a county with a population of more than 50,000;
18	(2) the Department of Family and Protective Services;
19	(3) the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation;
20	(4) the Office of Court Administration of the Texas
21	Judicial System;
22	(5) the Texas Department of Criminal Justice;
23	(6) the Texas Juvenile Justice Department; and
24	(7) [(2)] the Department of Public Safety.

- 1 (B) if available, information regarding any
 2 victims' service organization or program to which the victim was

- 4 An entity described by Subsection (a) that does not have any investigations or offenses required to be reported under this 5 section during a reporting period described by Subsection (c-1) 6 shall submit to the attorney general a notice stating there are no 7 cases to report, in the manner and form prescribed by the attorney 8 general [An attorney representing the state who prosecutes the alleged commission of an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code, or 10 the alleged commission of an offense under Chapter 43, Penal Code, 11 that may involve human trafficking, shall submit to the attorney 12 general the following information: 13
- [(1) the offense being prosecuted, including a brief
 description of the alleged prohibited conduct;
- [(2) any other charged offense that is part of the same
 criminal episode out of which the offense described by Subdivision
 the same of the
- [(3) the information described by Subsections (b)(2), 20 (3), (4), and (5); and
- [(4) the disposition of the prosecution, regardless of the manner of disposition].
- 23 <u>(c-1)</u> An entity described by Subsection (a) shall submit a 24 report under this section at least once every three months.
- (d) The attorney general may enter into a contract with a university or organization to assist with [that provides for the university's assistance in] the collection and analysis of

- 1 information received under this <u>section</u> [article]. The attorney
- 2 general shall ensure that all sensitive information is properly
- 3 protected.
- 4 (e) Information described by Subsections (b)(2)(A)(i) and
- 5 (v) and (b)(2)(B) is confidential and not subject to disclosure
- 6 under Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 7 <u>(f)</u> In consultation with the entities described by
- 8 Subsection (a), the attorney general shall adopt rules to
- 9 administer this section [article], including rules prescribing:
- 10 (1) the form and manner of submission of a report $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 11 notice required by Subsection (b) or (c); and
- 12 (2) additional information to include in a report or
- 13 notice required by Subsection (b) or (c).
- 14 (g) An entity, other than an entity described by Subsection
- 15 (a), that has information or evidence relating to the alleged
- 16 commission of an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code, or an
- 17 offense under Chapter 43, Penal Code, that may involve human
- 18 trafficking, may submit the information or evidence to the office
- 19 of the attorney general.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 402, Government Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Section 402.0353 to read as follows:
- Sec. 402.0353. STATEWIDE HUMAN TRAFFICKING DATA
- 23 REPOSITORY; ANNUAL REPORT. (a) The office of the attorney general
- 24 shall establish a statewide human trafficking data repository to
- 25 <u>collect</u>, organize, and analyze human trafficking information
- 26 reported to the office under Section 402.0352 in a manner that
- 27 enables the office to:

(1) evaluate the efficacy of state-funded initiatives 1 that aim to reduce the occurrence of human trafficking in this 2 3 state; 4 (2) make recommendations to appropriate local law 5 enforcement agencies, state agencies, and other entities regarding the implementation of rules, regulations, or policies which may 6 7 better allow each entity to: 8 (A) combat <u>human trafficking;</u> (B) apprehend and prosecute persons suspected of 9 10 committing criminal offenses involving human trafficking; and (C) provide necessary services to victims of 11 12 human trafficking; and (3) make recommendations to improve the efficacy of 13 14 the human trafficking prevention task force under Section 402.035. 15 Information stored in the data repository established under this section may not contain personal identifying information 16 17 relating to: 18 (1) a person suspected of committing an offense 19 involving human trafficking; 20 (2) a suspected or known victim of human trafficking; 21 or (3) any other individual identified in the information 22 shared with the office of the attorney general under Section 23 24 402.0352. (c) For purposes of establishing and maintaining the data 25 26 repository established under this section, the attorney general may

contract with a third party that has experience working with human

- 1 trafficking data and is:
- 2 (1) a public or private institution of higher
- 3 education; or
- 4 (2) a nonprofit organization.
- 5 (d) The attorney general shall annually submit to the
- 6 governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 7 representatives a report on the attorney general's findings and
- 8 recommendations based on the information collected, organized, and
- 9 analyzed using the data repository established under this section.
- 10 SECTION 3. Section 4.01, Chapter 93 (S.B. 1527), Acts of the
- 11 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, which amended Article
- 12 2.305, Code of Criminal Procedure, is repealed.
- SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Article 2A.205, Code of Criminal
- 14 Procedure, as transferred, redesignated, and amended by this Act,
- 15 an entity that was not required to report under that article, as it
- 16 existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, is not
- 17 required to submit the initial report required by that article
- 18 before July 1, 2026.
- 19 SECTION 5. Notwithstanding Section 402.0353, Government
- 20 Code, as added by this Act, the attorney general is not required to
- 21 submit the initial annual report required by that section before
- 22 July 1, 2027.
- 23 SECTION 6. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 24 over another Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025,
- 25 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 26 codes.
- 27 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
