BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Articles 62.102(c) and (d), Code of Criminal
Procedure, are amended to read as follows:

8 (c) If it is shown at the trial of a person for an offense or 9 an attempt to commit an offense under this article that the person 10 has previously been convicted of an offense or an attempt to commit 11 an offense under this article, the [punishment for the] offense or 12 the attempt to commit the offense is increased to the [punishment 13 for the] next highest category of offense [degree of felony].

14 (d) If it is shown at the trial of a person for an offense under this article or an attempt to commit an offense under this 15 16 article that the person fraudulently used identifying information in violation of Section 32.51, Penal Code, during the commission or 17 attempted commission of the offense, the [punishment for the] 18 offense or the attempt to commit the offense is increased to [the 19 punishment for] the next highest category of offense [degree of 20 21 felony].

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is

1 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
2 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
3 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
4 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
5 committed before that date.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
