BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 623.363, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and (c) to read as follows:

- (a) The commission may authorize a regional mobility authority to issue permits for the movement of oversize or overweight vehicles carrying cargo in Hidalgo County on:
  - (1) [the following roads:

- 1-48 (6) [(F)] Farm-to-Market Road 2061 between its 1-49 intersection with Farm-to-Market Road 3072 and its intersection 1-50 with U.S. Highway 281;
- 1-50 with U.S. Highway 281; 1-51 (7) [(G)] U.S. Highway 281 between its intersection 1-52 with the Pharr-Reynosa International Bridge and its intersection 1-53 with Spur 29;
- 1-54 (8) [<del>(H)</del>] Spur 29 between its intersection with U.S. 1-55 Highway 281 and its intersection with West Doffing [<del>Doffin Canal</del>] 1-56 Road;

(14) 365 Tollway between its intersection with Farm-to-Market Road 396 and its intersection with West Military Highway at San Juan Road [(2) another route designated by the commission in consultation with the authority].

(a-1) The authority authorized under this section shall pay from fees collected by the authority under Section 623.364 all costs to construct and maintain the route designated under Subsection (a)(9), and any off-system road designated after September 1, 2025.

(c) The authority authorized under this section may not issue a permit under this section for an oversize or overweight vehicle that is transporting in a cargo tank hazardous material in a quantity requiring placarding by a regulation issued under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (49 U.S.C. Section 5101 et seq.).

SECTION 2. Section 623.364(a), Transportation Code, amended to read as follows:

(a) The authority may collect a fee for permits issued under this subchapter. Beginning September 1, 2025 [2017], the maximum amount of the fee may not exceed \$250 [\$200] per trip. On September 1 of each subsequent year, the authority may adjust the maximum fee amount as necessary to reflect the percentage change during the preceding year in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), U.S. City Average, published monthly by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics or its successor in function.

SECTION 3. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this

section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

(b) This Act takes effect only if S.B. 2949, 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, is enacted and becomes law. If legislation described by this subsection is not enacted or does not become law, this Act has no effect.

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
