## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the compensation and benefits for certain peace
- 3 officers commissioned by the state fire marshal.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 417.006, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 417.006. STATE FIRE MARSHAL PEACE OFFICERS [AND ARSON
- 8 INVESTIGATORS]. (a) The state fire marshal may:
- 9 (1) commission peace officers to act as fire and arson
- 10 investigators under the state fire marshal's [his] supervision and
- 11 to perform other law enforcement duties assigned to the
- 12 commissioner and the state fire marshal by law; and
- 13 <u>(2)</u> [. The state fire marshal may] revoke a peace
- 14 officer's commission under this section for just cause.
- 15 (b) The commissioner shall ensure that a peace officer
- 16 commissioned under Subsection (a) is compensated according to
- 17 Schedule C of the position classification salary schedule
- 18 prescribed by the General Appropriations Act.
- SECTION 2. Section 659.301(5), Government Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 (5) "State employee" means an individual who:
- 22 (A) is a commissioned law enforcement officer of
- 23 the Department of Public Safety, the Texas Facilities Commission,
- 24 the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, the Texas Department of

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- 1 Criminal Justice, the attorney general, [er] the insurance fraud
- 2 unit of the Texas Department of Insurance, or the state fire
- 3 marshal;
- 4 (B) is a commissioned security officer of the
- 5 comptroller;
- 6 (C) is a law enforcement officer commissioned by
- 7 the Parks and Wildlife Commission;
- 8 (D) is a commissioned peace officer of an
- 9 institution of higher education;
- 10 (E) is an employee or official of the Board of
- 11 Pardons and Paroles or the parole division of the Texas Department
- 12 of Criminal Justice if the employee or official has routine direct
- 13 contact with inmates of any penal or correctional institution or
- 14 with administratively released prisoners subject to the board's
- 15 jurisdiction;
- 16 (F) has been certified to the Employees
- 17 Retirement System of Texas under Section 815.505 as having begun
- 18 employment as a law enforcement officer or custodial officer,
- 19 unless the individual has been certified to the system as having
- 20 ceased employment as a law enforcement officer or custodial
- 21 officer;
- (G) before May 29, 1987, received hazardous duty
- 23 pay based on the terms of any state law if the individual holds a
- 24 position designated under that law as eligible for the pay; or
- 25 (H) is a security officer employed by the Texas
- 26 Military Department.
- 27 SECTION 3. Section 661.918(a), Government Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (a) This section applies to a peace officer under Article
- 3 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure, who is commissioned as a law
- 4 enforcement officer or agent, including a ranger, by:
- 5 (1) the Public Safety Commission and the director of
- 6 the Department of Public Safety;
- 7 (2) the Parks and Wildlife Commission;
- 8 (3) the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission;
- 9 (4) the attorney general;
- 10 (5) the insurance fraud unit of the Texas Department
- 11 of Insurance; [or]
- 12 (6) the comptroller; or
- 13 (7) the state fire marshal.
- 14 SECTION 4. (a) The classification officer in the office of
- 15 the state auditor shall classify the position of commissioned peace
- 16 officer employed as an investigator by the Texas Department of
- 17 Insurance State Fire Marshal's Office as a Schedule C position
- 18 under the position classification plan maintained under Chapter
- 19 654, Government Code.
- 20 (b) The change made by the classification officer as
- 21 required by this section applies beginning with the state fiscal
- 22 biennium beginning September 1, 2025.
- 23 (c) This section expires September 1, 2027.
- SECTION 5. Section 661.918(a), Government Code, as amended
- 25 by this Act, applies only to an injury that occurs on or after the
- 26 effective date of this Act.
- 27 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
