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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the compensation and benefits for certain peace 1-21 1-22 1-23 officers commissioned by the state fire marshal. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 417.006, Government Code, is amended to 1-25 read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 417.006. STATE FIRE MARSHAL PEACE OFFICERS [AND ARSON INVESTIGATORS]. (a) The state fire marshal may: (1) commission peace officers to act as fire and arson 1-27

1-28 investigators under the state fire marshal's [his] supervision and 1-29 1-30 to perform other law enforcement duties assigned to the commissioner and the state fire marshal by law; and 1-31

(1) the Public Safety Commission and the director of the Department of Public Safety;

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(2) the Parks and Wildlife Commission; (3)the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission;

the insurance fraud unit of the Texas Department

the attorney general;

(6)the comptroller; or

(7) the state fire marshal.

SECTION 4. (a) The classification officer in the office of 2-23 the state auditor shall classify the position of commissioned peace 2-24 officer employed as an investigator by the Texas Department of Insurance State Fire Marshal's Office as a Schedule C position 2**-**25 2**-**26 2-27 under the position classification plan maintained under Chapter 2-28 654, Government Code.

(b) The change made by the classification officer as required by this section applies beginning with the state fiscal 2-29 2-30 2-31 biennium beginning September 1, 2025. 2-32

(c) This section expires September 1, 2027.

2-33 SECTION 5. Section 661.918(a), Government Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to an injury that occurs on or after the 2-34 2-35 effective date of this Act. 2-36

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
