A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to medical education coursework in cultural competence and
- 3 implicit bias.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 51.310 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 51.310. CULTURAL COMPETENCE AND IMPLICIT BIAS MEDICAL
- 8 EDUCATION COURSEWORK. (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
- 10 Education Coordinating Board.
- 11 (2) "Cultural competence" and "implicit bias" have the
- 12 meanings assigned by Section 153.017, Occupations Code.
- 13 (3) "Medical school" has the meaning assigned by
- 14 Section 61.501.
- 15 (b) The coordinating board by rule shall require a medical
- 16 school to offer coursework in cultural competence and implicit bias
- 17 approved by the Texas Medical Board under Section 153.017(b),
- 18 Occupations Code.
- 19 (c) A medical school may not award a student a doctor of
- 20 medicine (M.D.) or doctor of osteopathic medicine (D.O.) degree
- 21 unless the student has successfully completed the number of hours
- 22 of coursework in cultural competence and implicit bias required by
- 23 coordinating board rule.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 153, Occupations Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Section 153.017 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 153.017. COURSEWORK IN CULTURAL COMPETENCE AND
- 3 IMPLICIT BIAS. (a) In this section:
- 4 (1) "Cultural competence" means, with respect to
- 5 health care, the ability to effectively address the health issues
- 6 of individuals from diverse backgrounds by applying knowledge,
- 7 empathy, and insight into the views on health that those
- 8 backgrounds present.
- 9 (2) "Implicit bias" means:
- 10 (A) bias in judgment or behavior that results
- 11 from subtle cognitive processes, including implicit attitudes and
- 12 stereotypes, that often operate at a level below conscious
- 13 awareness and without intentional control; or
- 14 (B) implicit attitudes and stereotypes that
- 15 result in beliefs or simple associations that a person makes
- 16 between an object and its evaluation that are automatically
- 17 activated by the mere presence, actual or symbolic, of the attitude
- 18 object.
- 19 <u>(b) The board by rule shall approve coursework in cultural</u>
- 20 competence and implicit bias for purposes of Section 51.310,
- 21 Education Code.
- (c) Coursework approved under Subsection (b) must be:
- 23 <u>(1) designed to address medical decisions and</u>
- 24 treatment relating to a person's race, ethnicity, nationality,
- 25 language, sex, gender, physical and mental ability, and
- 26 socioeconomic status; and
- 27 (2) developed in consultation with:

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- 1 (A) the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 2 Board; and
- 3 (B) the Association of American Medical Colleges
- 4 or another nationally recognized organization that reviews medical
- 5 school curricula.
- 6 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2025, the Texas Higher
- 7 Education Coordinating Board and the Texas Medical Board shall
- 8 adopt the rules necessary to implement this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 51.310(c), Education Code, as added by
- 10 this Act, applies only to a student who enrolls in a doctor of
- 11 medicine (M.D.) or doctor of osteopathic medicine (D.O.) degree
- 12 program on or after January 1, 2026.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
