The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 2.2 the eligibility of an area to be released from a municipality's 23 24 extraterritorial jurisdiction as the result of a petition filed under Subchapter D, Chapter 42, Local Government Code, or an 25 26 election requested under Subchapter E of that chapter, as applicable, on or after the effective date of this Act. 27
