- 8 Sec. 1652.059. COVERAGE FOR CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS YOUNGER
- 9 THAN 65. (a) In this section, "entity" means an entity that
- 10 delivers or issues for delivery a Medicare supplement benefit plan

- 12 (b) An entity that offers coverage under a Medicare
- 13 supplement benefit plan to individuals 65 years of age or older must
- 14 offer the same coverage to individuals younger than 65 years of age
- 15 who are eligible for and enrolled in Medicare by reason of
- 16 disability, end stage renal disease, or amyotrophic lateral
- 17 sclerosis.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided by rules adopted under

- 3 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 4 a Medicare supplement benefit plan delivered, issued for delivery,
- 5 or renewed on or after September 1, 2025.
- 6 SECTION 3. In addition to other enrollment periods provided
- 7 by law, an individual younger than 65 years of age and enrolled in
- 8 Medicare Part B by reason of disability, end stage renal disease, or
- 9 amyotrophic lateral sclerosis on the effective date of this Act may
- 10 apply for coverage under a Medicare supplement benefit plan:
- 11 (1) after August 31, 2025, and before March 2, 2026; or
- 12 (2) if the individual is unable to submit an
- 13 application for coverage under the plan during the period described
- 14 by Subdivision (1) of this section because the application is not
- 15 available and the individual requested the application during that
- 16 period, during a six-month period beginning on the date the
