## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a school psychologist licensed under the Occupations
3	Code.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 38.303(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) The task force is composed of:
8	(1) the commissioner or the commissioner's designee;
9	(2) the following additional members appointed by the
10	commissioner:
11	(A) three parents of students who are enrolled in
12	school districts or open-enrollment charter schools and receive the
13	mental health services described by Section 38.302(1);
14	(B) one person who provides the mental health
15	services described by Section 38.302(1) or the training described
16	by Section 38.302(2) and who is:
17	(i) a licensed professional counselor, as
18	defined by Section 503.002, Occupations Code;
19	(ii) a licensed clinical social worker, as
20	defined by Section 505.002, Occupations Code; or
21	(iii) a school counselor certified under
22	Subchapter B, Chapter 21;
23	(C) one person who is a psychiatrist;

(D) two persons who are administrators of

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- 1 districts or schools that provide the mental health services
- 2 described by Section 38.302(1) or the training described by Section
- 3 38.302(2);
- 4 (E) one person who is a member of a foundation
- 5 that invests in the mental health services described by Section
- 6 38.302(1) or the training described by Section 38.302(2);
- 7 (F) one person who is an employee of an
- 8 institution of higher education designated under Section 38.307;
- 9 and
- 10 (G) one person who is a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>]
- 11 school psychologist [psychology], as defined by Section 501.002,
- 12 Occupations Code; and
- 13 (3) for any other entity the task force considers
- 14 necessary, one person appointed by the task force for each such
- 15 entity.
- SECTION 2. Section 61.601, Education Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- Sec. 61.601. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "mental
- 19 health professional" means:
- 20 (1) a licensed physician who is:
- 21 (A) a graduate of an accredited psychiatric
- 22 residency training program; or
- 23 (B) certified in psychiatry by:
- 24 (i) the American Board of Psychiatry and
- 25 Neurology; or
- 26 (ii) the American Osteopathic Board of
- 27 Neurology and Psychiatry;

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- 1 (2) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002,
- 2 Occupations Code;
- 3 (3) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by
- 4 Section 503.002, Occupations Code;
- 5 (4) an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined
- 6 by Section 301.152, Occupations Code, who holds a nationally
- 7 recognized board certification in psychiatric or mental health
- 8 nursing;
- 9 (5) a licensed clinical social worker, as defined by
- 10 Section 505.002, Occupations Code;
- 11 (6) a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>] school psychologist
- 12 [psychology], as defined by Section 501.002, Occupations Code;
- 13 (7) a chemical dependency counselor, as defined by
- 14 Section 504.001, Occupations Code; and
- 15 (8) a licensed marriage and family therapist, as
- 16 defined by Section 502.002, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 3. Section 61.607(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 (b) The total amount of repayment assistance received by a
- 20 mental health professional under this subchapter may not exceed:
- 21 (1) \$160,000, for assistance from the state received
- 22 by a licensed physician;
- 23 (2) \$80,000, for assistance from the state received
- 24 by:
- 25 (A) a psychologist;
- 26 (B) a licensed clinical social worker, if the
- 27 social worker has received a doctoral degree related to social

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1 work;
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- 2 (C) a licensed professional counselor, if the
- 3 counselor has received a doctoral degree related to counseling; or
- 4 (D) a licensed marriage and family therapist, if
- 5 the marriage and family therapist has received a doctoral degree
- 6 related to marriage and family therapy;
- 7 (3) \$60,000, for assistance from the state received by
- 8 an advanced practice registered nurse;
- 9 (4) \$40,000, for assistance from the state received
- 10 by:
- 11 (A) a licensed clinical social worker, a licensed
- 12 marriage and family therapist, or a licensed professional counselor
- 13 who is not described by Subdivision (2); or
- 14 (B) a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>] school
- 15 <u>psychologist</u> [<del>psychology</del>]; and
- 16 (5) \$10,000, for assistance from the state received by
- 17 a licensed chemical dependency counselor, if the chemical
- 18 dependency counselor has received an associate degree related to
- 19 chemical dependency counseling or behavioral science.
- SECTION 4. Section 411.12502(a), Government Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The Texas Behavioral Health Executive Council is
- 23 entitled to obtain criminal history record information as provided
- 24 by Subsection (b) that relates to a person who is an applicant for
- 25 or licensed as:
- 26 (1) a licensed psychologist, licensed psychological
- 27 associate, or [<del>licensed specialist in</del>] school psychologist

- 1 [psychology] under Chapter 501, Occupations Code;
- 2 (2) a licensed marriage and family therapist or
- 3 licensed marriage and family therapist associate under Chapter 502,
- 4 Occupations Code;
- 5 (3) a licensed professional counselor or licensed
- 6 professional counselor associate under Chapter 503, Occupations
- 7 Code; or
- 8 (4) a licensed baccalaureate social worker, licensed
- 9 master social worker, or licensed clinical social worker under
- 10 Chapter 505, Occupations Code.
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 548.0203(a), Government Code, as
- 12 effective April 1, 2025, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) In this section, "health professional" means an
- 14 individual who is:
- 15 (1) licensed, registered, certified, or otherwise
- 16 authorized by this state to practice as a social worker,
- 17 occupational therapist, or speech-language pathologist;
- 18 (2) a licensed professional counselor;
- 19 (3) a licensed marriage and family therapist; or
- 20 (4) a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>] school psychologist, as
- 21 defined by Section 501.002, Occupations Code [psychology].
- SECTION 6. Section 501.002(2), Occupations Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (2) "School psychologist" ["Licensed specialist in
- 25 school psychology"] means a person who holds a license to engage in
- 26 the practice of psychology under Section 501.260.
- 27 SECTION 7. Section 501.051(a-1), Occupations Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a-1) One of the members appointed under Subsection (a)(1)
- 3 or (a)(2) must practice as a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>] school
- 4 psychologist [psychology] under Section 501.260.
- 5 SECTION 8. The heading to Section 501.260, Occupations
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 501.260. [<del>LICENSED SPECIALIST IN</del>] SCHOOL <u>PSYCHOLOGIST</u>
- 8 [PSYCHOLOGY].
- 9 SECTION 9. Sections 501.260(a) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 10 are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The executive council by rule shall issue a license to a
- 12 [licensed specialist in] school psychologist [psychology]. A
- 13 license issued under this section constitutes the appropriate
- 14 credential for a person who provides psychological services as
- 15 required by Section 21.003(b), Education Code.
- 16 (c) The rules of practice for a [<del>licensed specialist in</del>]
- 17 school psychologist [psychology] must comply with nationally
- 18 recognized standards for the practice of school psychology.
- 19 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
