4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 4, Labor Code, is amended by
6	adding Chapter 321 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 321. CERTIFIED CAREGIVER PILOT PROGRAM
8	Sec. 321.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "program" means
9	the certified caregiver pilot program established under this
10	chapter.
11	Sec. 321.002. ESTABLISHMENT. (a) The commission shall
12	establish and administer the certified caregiver pilot program in
13	the Borderplex workforce development area to address the need for
14	after-hours child care for single-parent household working parents
15	who are pursuing a short-term workforce training program in the
16	area.
17	(b) The program shall:
18	(1) assist employees of child-care facilities
19	licensed under Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, with
20	obtaining a license under Section 321.004 in order to provide child
21	care to the children of eligible parents outside of regular working
22	hours in the employee's home; and
23	(2) provide supplemental subsidized child care for
24	single-parent households eligible under Section 321.005.

<u>Sec. 321.003. PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION.</u> (a) The local
workforce development board serving the Borderplex workforce
development area shall select a total of 30 single-parent families
eligible under Section 321.005 that will qualify for supplemental
subsidized child care for a period of not more than six months.

6 (b) A certified caregiver licensed under Section 321.004 7 shall be eligible to participate in the commission's subsidized 8 child-care program to provide child care outside regular working 9 hours to a child of a parent participating in the program.

Sec. 321.004. LICENSE FOR CERTIFIED CAREGIVER. (a) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt a procedure to issue a license to a caregiver who meets the requirements of this section that allows the caregiver to operate as a listed family home for purposes of the pilot program.

15 (b) The procedure must require a caregiver to:

16 (1) be a current employee of a child-care facility 17 licensed under Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, with not less than 18 two years of child-care experience;

19 (2) provide after-hours child care in the caregiver's 20 own home; and

21 (3) list the caregiver's home with the Health and Human 22 Services Commission as a family home and comply with minimum 23 standards for a listed family home adopted by the executive 24 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission under 25 Section 42.042, Human Resources Code.

26 <u>Sec. 321.005. PARENT ELIGIBILITY.</u> To be eligible to 27 <u>receive a child-care subsidy under the program, a parent must, at</u>

2	(1) receive a subsidy under the commission's
3	child-care subsidy program;
4	(2) reside in a single-parent household;
5	(3) have completed a sufficient number of
6	postsecondary education credit hours, as determined by the
7	<pre>commission;</pre>
8	(4) be enrolled in or agree to enroll in a short-term
9	workforce training program supported by the local workforce
10	development board serving the Borderplex workforce development
11	area; and
12	(5) demonstrate a need for child care outside of
13	regular working hours in order to complete the workforce training
14	program described under Subdivision (4).
15	Sec. 321.006. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2028, the
16	commission shall prepare and submit to the governor, lieutenant
17	governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and standing
18	committee of each house of the legislature with primary
19	jurisdiction over economic development a report on:
20	(1) the efficacy of the program;
21	(2) the completion rate of workforce training programs
22	by parents receiving child care under the program;
23	(3) the total cost of the program; and
24	(4) a recommendation on whether to continue, expand,
25	or terminate the program.
26	Sec. 321.007. RULES. The commission shall adopt rules
27	necessary to implement this chapter.
