4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 2306, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 2306.0945 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 2306.0945. EMERGENCY HOMELESS SHELTER EQUITABLE
8	OPERATIONS POLICIES. (a) This section applies only to an emergency
9	homeless shelter that receives financial assistance administered
10	by the department, including federal funds described by Section
11	2306.094.
12	(b) The department by rule shall require each emergency
13	homeless shelter to adopt and implement equitable operations
14	policies designed to ensure that individuals experiencing
15	homelessness in this state have equal access to shelter and support
16	services regardless of the individuals' race, ethnicity, national
17	origin, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, religion,
18	disability, or other protected status.
19	(c) The equitable operations policies must require ar

admission of individuals to and the discharge of individuals from

the shelter and in the provision of services;

(1) eliminate discriminatory practices in the

(2) offer culturally and linguistically appropriate

- 2 (3) ensure that each individual receiving services
- 3 from the shelter has access to the same level of basic amenities,
- 4 such as clean and safe sleeping accommodations, showers, restrooms,
- 5 and laundry facilities;
- 6 (4) provide individuals receiving services from the
- 7 shelter with access to supportive services, such as case
- 8 management, employment assistance, health care, and mental health
- 9 and substance use treatment;
- 10 (5) prioritize the needs of individuals who are most
- 11 vulnerable, including families with children, pregnant
- 12 individuals, individuals with disabilities, and survivors of
- 13 domestic violence;
- 14 (6) adopt trauma-informed care practices to ensure
- 15 that each individual receiving services from the shelter is treated
- 16 with dignity and respect;
- 17 (7) provide staff training and professional
- 18 development on issues related to equity, diversity, and inclusion;
- 19 (8) establish and implement other holistic operations
- 20 policies determined by the department to maximize the opportunity
- 21 for stabilization of the community the shelter serves during and
- 22 <u>after a public emergency; and</u>
- 23 (9) collect and report data to the department in
- 24 accordance with department rule on the demographic characteristics
- 25 of shelter residents and outcomes achieved.
- 26 <u>(d) The department shall develop and distribute to each</u>
- 27 emergency shelter guidelines and best practices for the adoption

- 1 and implementation of the equitable operations policies.
- 2 <u>(e) The department shall monitor emergency homeless</u>
- 3 shelters to ensure compliance with this section.
- 4 (f) The department may not provide financial assistance to
- 5 an emergency shelter that fails to adopt and implement the
- 6 equitable operations policies required by this section.
- 7 (g) The department may collaborate with local emergency
- 8 <u>homeless</u> shelter regulatory authorities in carrying out this
- 9 section.
- 10 (h) The senate finance committee and the house
- 11 appropriations committee shall use the equitable operations
- 12 policies required by this section as a guide in determining the
- 13 costs and funding sources of those policies.
- 14 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- of this Act, the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs
- 16 shall adopt the rules required by Section 2306.0945, Government
- 17 Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
