H.B. No. 2755

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to requirements for and transparency of epidemiological reports and immunization exemption information and reports. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 81.047, Health and Safety Code, 5 is amended to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 81.047. EPIDEMIOLOGICAL REPORTS. (a) Subject to the confidentiality requirements of this chapter, the department shall 8 9 require epidemiological reports of disease outbreaks and of individual cases of disease suspected or known to be of importance 10 to the public health, including vaccine preventable diseases. The 11 12 department shall evaluate the reports to determine the trends involved and the nature and magnitude of the hazards. 13 14 (b) The department shall prepare and submit to the legislature and the governor not later than December 1 of each 15 16 even-numbered year a biennial report that contains: (1) a report of outbreaks of vaccine preventable 17 diseases in this state; and 18 (2) de-identified immunization exemption information, 19 including the number of persons claiming an exemption from the 20 21 immunization requirements of Section 161.004 of this code, Sections 38.001, 51.9192, and 51.933, Education Code, and Section 42.043, 22 23 Human Resources Code. SECTION 2. Section 38.002, Education Code, is amended by 24

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1 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsections (d), (e), 2 (f), and (g) to read as follows:

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3 (a) Each public school shall keep an individual immunization record during the period of attendance for each 4 5 student admitted. The records shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times by the <u>agency</u> [Texas Education Agency] or by 6 representatives of local health departments or the [Texas] 7 8 Department of State Health Services.

9 (c) The <u>agency</u> [Texas Education Agency] and the [Texas] 10 Department of <u>State</u> Health <u>Services</u> shall develop the form for a 11 required annual report of the immunization status of students <u>that</u> 12 <u>includes de-identified immunization exemption information</u>. The 13 report shall be submitted by all schools at the time and in the 14 manner indicated in the instructions printed on the form.

15 (d) Each school district shall provide to the Department of
16 State Health Services the information required by Subsection (c)
17 for the district and each school campus in the district.

(e) The Department of State Health Services shall post on
the department's public Internet website the required annual report
submitted under Subsection (c) on the immunization status of
students for each school district and each school campus.

22 (f) On request of a student's parent or legal guardian, a 23 school district or school campus shall provide to the parent or 24 guardian a copy of the following information for the campus at which 25 the student is enrolled:

26 (1) the immunization rate disaggregated by type of 27 vaccine; and

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1	(2) the information submitted under Subsection (c),
2	including:
3	(A) de-identified immunization exemption
4	information;
5	(B) the number of students provisionally
6	enrolled pending documentation of immunization;
7	(C) the number of students claiming an exemption
8	for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief;
9	(D) the number of students claiming an exemption
10	for a medical reason; and
11	(E) the number of students whose vaccinations are
12	not current.
13	(g) The commissioner and the executive commissioner of the
14	Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt rules as necessary
15	to ensure a report of the immunization status of students provided
16	under Subsections (e) and (f) complies with federal law regarding
17	confidentiality of student medical or educational information,
18	including the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act
19	of 1996 (42 U.S.C. Section 1320d et seq.) and the Family Educational
20	Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g).
21	SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
22	of this Act, the Texas Education Agency shall update the form
23	required by Section 38.002(c), Education Code, as amended by this
24	Act, to comply with that subsection.

25 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 26 school year.

27 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
