Section 455.152, Occupations Code, as amended by Chapters 13 (S.B. 483) and 440 (H.B. 2016), Acts of the 88th 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, is reenacted and amended to 8 read as follows: 9 Sec. 455.152. INELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSE. A person is not 10 11 eligible for a license as a massage establishment, massage school, 12 massage therapist, or massage therapy instructor if the person is an individual and has been convicted of, entered a plea of nolo 13 14 contendere or guilty to, or received deferred adjudication for: 15 (1) an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code [Section 22.011 or 22.021 Penal Code], or Section 21.02, 21.09, 21.11, 16 21.12, 21.15, 21.16, 21.165, 21.18, 22.011, 22.012, 22.021, 25.02, 17 43.021, 43.03, 43.031, 43.04, 43.041, [or] 43.05, 43.25, 43.26, or 18 43.262, Penal Code; [or] 19 20 (2) <u>criminal attempt</u>, <u>conspiracy</u>, <u>or solicitation</u>

- 7 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 8 of this Act, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall
- 9 adopt rules necessary to implement Sections 455.152 and 455.251,
- 10 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 22.011, Penal Code, as amended by this
- 12 Act, applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective
- 13 date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of
- 14 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was
- 15 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 16 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 17 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 18 occurred before that date.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
