- 2 relating to civil liability for sexual assault resulting in a

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Title 4, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Chapter 98C to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 98C. LIABILITY FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT RESULTING IN PREGNANCY
- 8 Sec. 98C.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "sexual
- 9 assault" means conduct described by Section 22.011, Penal Code.
- 10 Sec. 98C.002. LIABILITY FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT RESULTING IN
- 11 PREGNANCY. (a) A defendant who commits an act of sexual assault is
- 12 liable to the victim of the sexual assault, as provided by this
- 13 chapter, for damages arising out of a pregnancy resulting from the
- 14 sexual assault if the victim carries the pregnancy to term.
- (b) It is not a defense to liability under this chapter that
- 16 a defendant has been acquitted or has not been prosecuted or
- 17 convicted under Section 22.011, Penal Code, or has been convicted
- 18 of a different offense or of a different type of offense, for the
- 19 conduct that is alleged to give rise to liability under this
- 20 <u>chapter.</u>
- Sec. 98C.003. DAMAGES. (a) A claimant who prevails in an
- 22 action brought under this chapter is entitled to recover actual
- 23 damages related to the pregnancy, the birth, and the care of the
- 24 child, including:

- 1 (1) medical expenses, including prenatal care,
- 2 delivery costs, and postnatal care;
- 3 (2) loss of income, wages, or earning capacity;
- 4 (3) any other economic damages related to the
- 5 pregnancy, birth, or care of the child; and
- 6 (4) noneconomic damages, as defined by Section 41.001.
- 7 (b) Noneconomic damages, including damages for mental
- 8 anguish and physical and emotional pain and suffering, may be
- 9 awarded to a claimant who prevails in an action brought under this
- 10 chapter regardless of whether economic damages are awarded to the
- 11 claimant.
- 12 Sec. 98C.004. CAUSE OF ACTION CUMULATIVE. The cause of
- 13 action created by this chapter is cumulative of any other remedy
- 14 provided by common law or statute, including the ability to seek
- 15 payments for support of a child under Chapter 154, Family Code.
- 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 98C, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 17 as added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues
- 18 on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
