2	relating to the designation of controlled substance overdose for
3	purposes of the death certificate.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 193.005(e-1), Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(e-1) The medical certification on a death certificate must
8	include <u>:</u>
9	$\underline{(1)}$ either the term "Fentanyl Poisoning" or the term
10	"Fentanyl Toxicity" if:
11	$\overline{(A)}$ [$\overline{(1)}$] a toxicology examination reveals a
12	controlled substance listed in Penalty Group 1-B present in the
13	body of the decedent in an amount or concentration that is
14	considered to be lethal by generally accepted scientific standards;
15	and
16	(B) [(2)] the results of an autopsy performed on
17	the decedent are consistent with an opioid overdose as the cause of
18	death; and
19	(2) the term "Controlled Substance Overdose" and, if
20	possible to ascertain, the type of controlled substance present in
21	the body of the decedent if:
22	(A) a toxicology examination reveals a
23	controlled substance, other than a controlled substance listed in
24	Penalty Group 1-B, present in the body of the decedent in an amount

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- 1 or concentration that is considered to be lethal by generally
- 2 accepted scientific standards; and
- 3 (B) the results of an autopsy performed on the
- 4 <u>decedent are consistent with a controlled substance overdose as the</u>
- 5 cause of death.
- 6 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to a death that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act or
- 8 a death that occurs before that date but is discovered on or after
- 9 the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
