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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to parental rights in public education and prohibiting instruction regarding sexual orientation or gender identity for 3 public school students. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 26.011, Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 Sec. 26.011. COMPLAINTS; CIVIL REMEDY. 8 9 SECTION 2. Section 26.011, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsections (c), (d), and (e) to read as follows: 10 11 (c) A grievance procedure adopted under this section must require that, not later than the 30th day after receipt of a 12 complaint described by Subsection (a), the school district: 13 14 (1) resolve the issue that gave rise to the complaint; 15 or 16 (2) provide to the parent who submitted the complaint a written explanation of the district's reason for not resolving 17 the issue. 18 (d) If a school district does not resolve an issue described 19 by Subsection (c)(1), the parent may bring a civil action against 20 the district to obtain appropriate injunctive and declaratory 21 relief. A court may award damages and shall award reasonable 22 23 attorney's fees and court costs to a prevailing parent. Remedies provided by this subsection are not exclusive. Governmental 24

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1	immunity of a school district to suit and from liability is waived
2	to the extent of liability created by this subsection.
3	(e) The board of trustees of each school district shall
4	adopt a policy for notifying parents of students enrolled in the
5	district regarding the grievance procedure adopted by the district
6	under this section.
7	SECTION 3. Chapter 26, Education Code, is amended by adding
8	Sections 26.0083, 26.0084, and 26.016 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 26.0083. RIGHT TO INFORMATION REGARDING MENTAL,
10	EMOTIONAL, AND PHYSICAL HEALTH AND HEALTH-RELATED SERVICES. (a)
11	Each school district shall adopt a procedure for notifying the
12	parent of a student enrolled in the district regarding any change
13	<u>in:</u>
14	(1) services provided to or monitoring of the student
15	related to the student's mental, emotional, or physical health or
16	well-being; or
17	(2) the district's ability to provide a safe and
18	supportive learning environment for the student.
19	(b) A procedure adopted under Subsection (a) must reinforce
20	the fundamental right of a parent to make decisions regarding the
21	upbringing and education of the parent's child by requiring school
22	district personnel to:
23	(1) encourage a student to discuss issues relating to
24	the student's well-being with the student's parent; or
25	(2) facilitate a discussion described under
26	Subdivision (1).
27	(c) A school district may not adopt a procedure or a student

support form, including a student well-being questionnaire or 1 2 health screening form, that: 3 (1) prohibits a district employee from notifying the 4 parent of a student regarding: 5 (A) information about the student's mental, emotional, or physical health or well-being; or 6 7 (B) a change in services provided to or monitoring of the student related to the student's mental, 8 emotional, or physical health or well-being; or 9 10 (2) encourages or has the effect of encouraging a student to withhold from the student's parent information described 11 12 by Subdivision (1)(A). (d) A school district employee may not discourage or 13 prohibit parental knowledge of or involvement in critical decisions 14 affecting a student's mental, emotional, or physical health or 15 16 well-being. 17 (e) Before the first instructional day of each school year, a school district shall provide to the parent of each student 18 19 enrolled in the district written notice of each health-related service offered at the district campus the student attends. The 20 notice must include a statement of the parent's right to withhold 21 consent for or <u>decline a health-related service</u>. A parent's 22 23 consent to a health-related service does not waive a requirement of 24 Subsection (a), (c), or (d). (f) Before administering a student support form to a 25 26 student, a school district must provide a copy of the form to the student's parent and obtain the parent's consent to administer the 27

2	(g) Not later than June 30, 2026, the agency, the State
3	Board of Education, and the State Board for Educator Certification,
4	as appropriate, shall review and revise as necessary the following
5	to ensure compliance with this section:
6	(1) school counseling frameworks and standards;
7	(2) educator practices and professional conduct
8	principles; and
9	(3) any other student services personnel guidelines,
10	standards, or frameworks.
11	(h) Subsection (g) and this subsection expire September 1,
12	<u>2027.</u>
13	Sec. 26.0084. RIGHT TO INFORMATION REGARDING STUDENT'S
14	PERCEPTION OF BIOLOGICAL SEX. A school district employee or
15	independent contractor of a district, including a third-party
16	instructor, guest speaker, or subcontractor, may not withhold from
17	a student's parent information related to the student's perception
18	of the student's biological sex if that perception is inconsistent
19	with the student's biological sex as determined by the student's sex
20	organs, chromosomes, and endogenous hormone profiles.
21	Sec. 26.016. CONSENT REQUIRED FOR PARTICIPATION IN CERTAIN
22	STUDENT CLUBS. (a) In this section, "student club" means any
23	student organization sponsored or sanctioned by a school district.
24	(b) A school district shall require written parental
25	consent as a condition of a student's participation in a student
26	club that promotes themes of sexuality, gender, or gender identity.
27	(c) A school district shall seek parental consent under this

1 section by providing a written form to a parent that includes the foundational documents of the student club described by Subsection 2 3 (b) in which the student wishes to participate, including: (1) the name of the club; 4 5 (2) the mission statement or purpose of the club; and 6 (3) any additional information determined appropriate 7 by the school district. 8 SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 28.0041 to read as follows: 9 10 Sec. 28.0041. INSTRUCTION REGARDING SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY PROHIBITED. A school district, open-enrollment 11 12 charter school, or district or charter school employee may not provide or allow a third party to provide instruction regarding 13 sexual orientation or gender identity to students enrolled in the 14 district or school. 15 SECTION 5. Section 12.104(b), Education Code, is amended to 16 17 read as follows: An open-enrollment charter school is subject to: 18 (b) 19 (1) a provision of this title establishing a criminal offense; 20 21 (2) the provisions in Chapter 554, Government Code; and 2.2 (3) a prohibition, restriction, or requirement, as 23 24 applicable, imposed by this title or a rule adopted under this title, relating to: 25 26 (A) the Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) to the extent necessary to monitor compliance with 27

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1 this subchapter as determined by the commissioner; 2 (B) criminal history records under Subchapter C, 3 Chapter 22; 4 (C) reading instruments and accelerated reading 5 instruction programs under Section 28.006; 6 (D) accelerated instruction under Section 7 28.0211; 8 (E) high school graduation requirements under 9 Section 28.025; 10 (F) special education programs under Subchapter A, Chapter 29; 11 12 (G) bilingual education under Subchapter Β, 13 Chapter 29; 14 (H) prekindergarten programs under Subchapter E 15 or E-1, Chapter 29, except class size limits for prekindergarten classes imposed under Section 25.112, which do not apply; 16 17 (I) extracurricular activities under Section 33.081; 18 discipline management practices or behavior 19 (J) management techniques under Section 37.0021; 20 21 health and safety under Chapter 38; (K) 22 the provisions of Subchapter A, Chapter 39; (L) public school accountability and special 23 (M) 24 investigations under Subchapters A, B, C, D, F, G, and J, Chapter 39, and Chapter 39A; 25 26 (N) the requirement under Section 21.006 to 27 report an educator's misconduct;

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1	(Z) parental rights to:
2	(i) information regarding a student's
3	mental, emotional, and physical health and health-related services
4	offered by the school as provided by Section 26.0083;
5	(ii) information regarding a student's
6	perception of the student's biological sex as provided by Section
7	26.0084; and
8	(iii) consent to a student's participation
9	in a student club that promotes themes of sexuality, gender, or
10	gender identity as provided by Section 26.016.
11	SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
12	school year.
13	SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
14	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
15	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
16	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
17	Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
