## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to financial incentives for public school teachers who
3	commit to teach a dual credit course.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter QQ to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER QQ. FINANCIAL INCENTIVE PROGRAM FOR DUAL CREDIT COURSE
8	<u>TEACHERS</u>
9	Sec. 61.9981. ESTABLISHMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM.
10	The board shall establish a program to provide tuition assistance
11	to assist teachers in obtaining a master's degree required to teach
12	a dual credit course.
13	Sec. 61.9982. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive
14	tuition assistance under this subchapter, a person must:
15	(1) apply to the board in the form and manner
16	<pre>prescribed by board rule;</pre>
17	(2) be enrolled in a master's degree program at ar
18	institution of higher education;
19	(3) hold a certificate issued under Subchapter B,
20	<pre>Chapter 21;</pre>
21	(4) enter into an agreement with the board as provided
22	by Section 61.9983; and
23	(5) at the time of application for tuition assistance:
24	(A) have been employed full time for at least one

- 1 year by a public school in this state; and
- 2 (B) currently be employed full time by a public
- 3 school in this state.
- 4 Sec. 61.9983. AGREEMENT. To qualify for tuition assistance
- 5 under this subchapter, a person must enter into a written agreement
- 6 with the board as provided by this section. The agreement must
- 7 require the person to:
- 8 (1) obtain, within the period prescribed by board
- 9 rule, a master's degree required to teach a dual credit course; and
- 10 (2) teach a dual credit course in a public school in
- 11 this state for the next five school years.
- 12 Sec. 61.9984. TUITION ASSISTANCE. (a) The board by rule
- 13 shall establish the amount of tuition assistance that may be
- 14 awarded to each participant in the program.
- 15 (b) The board shall deliver any tuition assistance awarded
- 16 under this subchapter directly to an institution of higher
- 17 education on the participant's behalf.
- Sec. 61.9985. REIMBURSEMENT; EXCEPTIONS. (a) A program
- 19 participant who fails to meet the requirements of Section 61.9983
- 20 shall reimburse the board for the amount of any tuition assistance
- 21 received by the participant under this subchapter.
- (b) The board shall grant a participant, in the event of a
- 23 hardship or for other good cause shown, a one-year grace period to
- 24 meet the requirements of Section 61.9983 before requiring the
- 25 participant to reimburse the board under Subsection (a).
- Sec. 61.9986. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. In addition to
- 27 using money appropriated by the legislature for this purpose, the

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- 1 board may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations for the
- 2 purposes of this subchapter.
- 3 Sec. 61.9987. RULES. The board shall adopt rules necessary
- 4 for the administration of this subchapter, including a rule that
- 5 sets the maximum amount of tuition assistance a person may receive
- 6 under this subchapter.
- 7 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 8 shall adopt rules for the administration of Subchapter QQ, Chapter
- 9 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable
- 10 after this Act takes effect.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
