A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to providing a designation for school district campuses
- 3 that take certain action to address the mental and behavioral
- 4 health and well-being of students.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 33.917 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 33.917. ADVANCING WELLNESS AND RESILIENCY IN EDUCATION
- 9 (AWARE) CAMPUS. (a) In this section, "school climate" has the
- 10 meaning assigned by Section 38.351(d).
- 11 (b) The agency shall designate a school district campus as
- 12 an Advancing Wellness and Resiliency in Education (AWARE) Campus if
- 13 the campus applies and qualifies for the designation under this
- 14 section.
- 15 (c) To qualify as an Advancing Wellness and Resiliency in
- 16 Education (AWARE) Campus, a school district campus must:
- 17 (1) employ a school counselor who spends at least 80
- 18 percent of the counselor's total work time on duties included in a
- 19 comprehensive school counseling program developed under Section
- 20 33.005;
- 21 (2) maintain formal community partnerships with
- 22 <u>community-based mental and behavioral health care providers to</u>
- 23 increase student and family access to care, including by
- 24 contracting with:

1	(A) a local mental health authority; and
2	(B) the Texas Child Mental Health Care
3	Consortium;
4	(3) offer training for campus staff members on issues
5	related to the mental and behavioral health and well-being of
6	students as required by Sections 21.451, 22.904, 38.036, and 38.351
7	and maintain documentation of the completion of the training;
8	(4) as part of the safe and supportive school program
9	implemented under Section 37.115, provide a systemic and
10	coordinated multitiered support system that addresses school
11	climate, the social and emotional domain, psychological safety, and
12	mental and behavioral health, which must include:
13	(A) a multidisciplinary team for the
14	coordination of campus multitiered support system strategies;
15	(B) the maintenance of a resource list of
16	available school-based, school-connected, and community-based
17	mental and behavioral health and well-being interventions and
18	supports available to students and families;
19	(C) a referral pathway for mental and behavioral
20	health and well-being interventions and supports available to
21	students and families in need of additional support outside of
22	school; and
23	(D) methods to objectively measure positive
24	school climate in the school; and
25	(5) maintain on the campus's Internet website an
26	easily accessible web page that includes information on how to
27	access school-based and community-based mental and behavioral

- 2 students and families, including:
- 3 (A) counseling and other mental and behavioral
- 4 health and well-being support services, including out-of-school
- 5 time programs;
- 6 (B) community-based mental and behavioral health
- 7 and well-being support services; and
- 8 (C) district referral procedures and parental
- 9 rights related to students accessing mental and behavioral health
- 10 and well-being support services, including information on:
- 11 (i) parental consent guidelines and
- 12 requirements under Sections 33.003, 38.010, and 38.053;
- (ii) parental access to medical records
- 14 under Section 38.0095;
- 15 (iii) coordinated health programs
- 16 available under Section 38.013;
- 17 (iv) the prohibition on the use of a
- 18 parent's refusal to consent to a psychiatric evaluation or
- 19 examination as grounds to take certain actions against a child and
- 20 the permissible actions under Section 38.016;
- 21 <u>(v)</u> the district's trauma-informed care
- 22 policy under Section 38.036;
- 23 <u>(vi) the identification of health-related</u>
- 24 concerns under Section 38.057;
- 25 <u>(vii) educational materials provided in</u>
- 26 <u>accordance with a procedure developed under Section 38.351(i-1);</u>
- 27 and

- 1 (viii) the consent required for services to
- 2 minors under Section 113.0152, Health and Safety Code.
- 3 (d) To comply with a requirement under Subsection (c)(3),
- 4 (4), or (5), a school district campus may partner with the district
- 5 to provide:
- (1) training required under Subsection (c)(3);
- 7 (2) a requirement for the multitiered support system
- 8 under Subsection (c)(4); or
- 9 <u>(3) if the campus does not have an Internet website, a</u>
- 10 web page that meets the requirements of Subsection (c)(5).
- 11 (e) The agency shall adopt rules as necessary to administer
- 12 this section.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 14 school year.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
