A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to training for peace officers on interacting with persons
- 3 with autism spectrum disorder.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Subsection (u) to read as follows:
- 7 (u) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 8 commission shall require an officer to complete the training
- 9 program established under Section 1701.273.
- 10 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 1701.273 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 1701.273. TRAINING PROGRAM ON INTERACTING WITH PERSONS
- 13 WITH AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER. (a) In this section, "autism
- 14 spectrum disorder" means:
- 15 (1) a neurobiological disorder or developmental
- 16 disability that significantly affects verbal communication,
- 17 nonverbal communication, and social interaction and that meets the
- 18 diagnostic criteria for autism spectrum disorder specified by the
- 19 Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, 5th Edition,
- 20 <u>or a later edition; or</u>
- 21 (2) a diagnosis made using a previous edition of the
- 22 Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders of autism,
- 23 Asperger's syndrome, or Pervasive Developmental Disorder--Not
- 24 Otherwise Specified.

(b) The commission by rule shall establish and maintain a 1 training program for officers on interacting with a person with 2 3 autism spectrum disorder. 4 (c) The training program must be not less than two hours. 5 (d) The training program must be evidence-based and include the following topics: 6 7 (1) understanding the nature of autism spectrum disorder and the differing manifestations of the disorder in a 8 person, including: 9 10 (A) identifying a person with autism spectrum disorder and differentiating that person from another person who 11 12 does not have the disorder and who may be uncooperative or intending to commit a criminal offense; and 13 (B) understanding the relationship between 14 15 autism spectrum disorder and criminal or otherwise antisocial 16 behavior; 17 (2) effectively communicating with a person with autism spectrum disorder, including best practices on: 18 19 (A) communicating without causing the person 20 unnecessary stress; 21 (B) interviewing and interrogating the person; 22 and 23 (C) de-escalating an interaction with the 24 person; 25 (3) locating a person with autism spectrum disorder 26 who has run away and may be in danger;

(4) recognizing the circumstances under which a person

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- 1 with autism spectrum disorder may be abused, coerced, or criminally
- 2 exploited, including radicalization of the person;
- 3 (5) ensuring the safety of a person with autism
- 4 spectrum disorder who is confined in a correctional facility; and
- 5 (6) understanding the laws on taking a person into
- 6 custody and applying for emergency detention under Subtitle C,
- 7 Title 7, Health and Safety Code.
- 8 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 9 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt
- 10 rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. The minimum curriculum requirements under
- 12 Section 1701.253(u), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, apply
- 13 only to an officer who first begins to satisfy those requirements on
- 14 or after January 1, 2026.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
