(d) This section does not apply to an action if:

3 (1) the agreement described by this section was4 unconscionable at the time that it was made;

5 (2) the agreement regarding venue is [voidable] void
6 under Chapter 272, Business & Commerce Code; or

7 (3) venue is established under a statute of this state8 other than this title.

9 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 10 a contract that is entered into or renewed on or after the effective 11 date of this Act.

12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
