A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the provision of medication for respiratory distress in
- 3 public and private schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 38.211, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (b-1) and amending Subsection (c) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (b-1) The commissioner of state health services or, if the
- 9 commissioner is not a physician, the chief medical executive of the
- 10 Department of State Health Services may issue a statewide standing
- 11 order prescribing medication for respiratory distress to a school
- 12 district, open-enrollment charter school, or private school.
- 13 (c) The standing order under Subsection (b) or (b-1) is not
- 14 required to be patient-specific, and the epinephrine auto-injector
- 15 or medication for respiratory distress may be administered to a
- 16 person without a previously established physician-patient
- 17 relationship.
- 18 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 38.2115 to read as follows:
- 20 <u>Sec. 38.2115. CONTRACTING FOR MEDICATION FOR RESPIRATORY</u>
- 21 DISTRESS AND TRAINING. The board of trustees of a school district
- 22 or governing body of an open-enrollment charter school or private
- 23 school may contract with a vendor to provide:
- 24 (1) medication for respiratory distress and related

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- 1 equipment to the district or school; and
- 2 (2) training to school personnel and school volunteers
- 3 <u>authorized to administer medication for respiratory distress under</u>
- 4 this subchapter.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
